- *Practiced writing CVC words by breaking them apart into their beginning, middle, and ending sounds and writing a letter for each sound we hear
 - *Practiced spelling phonetically by labeling pictures.
 - *Read and acted out *The Mitten* by Jan Brett
- *Practiced identifying pairs of rhyming words and thinking of a word to rhyme with a given word.
 - *Went on a nature walk to explore winter with our five senses.



