Focus of the Month: IB Learner Principled

At the heart of the International Baccalaureate (IB) program is a commitment to developing not just strong students, but strong character. This month, we are highlighting the Learner Profile trait Principled.

Being principled means acting with honesty, fairness, and integrity. It means doing the right thing, even when no one is watching. Principled students take responsibility for their actions, admit mistakes, respect others, and stand up for what is fair and just.

In school, this looks like:

- Completing work honestly
- Giving credit to others
- Following classroom expectations
- Speaking up when something is unfair
- Accepting consequences and learning from mistakes

Beyond the classroom, being principled helps students:

- Build trust in friendships
- Develop strong leadership skills
- Show respect for different cultures and perspectives
- Become responsible members of their community
