
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CSA EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM:

- **Math:** The instructional learning targets of the CSA middle school math curriculum focus on developing students' proficiency in key mathematical areas such as ratios, geometry, algebraic expressions, and statistics, while fostering critical thinking, problem-solving, and real-world application skills. The curriculum is designed to prepare students for high school math and beyond by encouraging a deep understanding of mathematical concepts.
 - This month, students will be exploring concepts of algebraic equations (Foundations Math), proportions, discounts, markups, and simple interest (Applied Math); data analysis and displays and functions (Intro to Integrated Math), exponential functions and data analysis and displays and Integrated I Math); and probability and relationships with triangles (Integrated II Math).
- **Literature (Pod A):** First year readers have recently begun their next read-aloud unit: *Out of my Mind* by Sharon Draper. This novel explores a heartwarming story about a gifted girl named Melody Brooks, a brilliant 11-year-old with cerebral palsy, who has a photographic memory but can't speak, walk, or write, leading others to underestimate her until she gets a device to communicate, revealing her genius and facing challenges of inclusion and acceptance. Students will engage with the text by collaborating with peers and answering discussion questions, reflecting on the relationships between characters, and designing their own MediTalker before culminating their comprehension in an original essay.
- **Social Studies (Pod A):** This month, students will be finishing our unit on economics and preparing for their Social Studies Term 2 assessment on March 12th. After the assessment, they will spend the final week of the term putting their knowledge into action through a civics-based portfolio project that will carry us through the end of the term. During the first week of Term 3 – the week before spring break – we will begin our final unit of the year. I look forward to guiding students as we explore what it truly means to be a citizen and the responsibilities and opportunities that come with that role.
- **Science (POD A):** This month in science, students will continue to play the role of genetic researchers connecting their learning about spider genetics to real-world human examples. Students will apply what they've learned about how traits vary (including from the Darwin's bark spider case study) to a new scenario about a family of runners. They will analyze evidence about the ACTN3 gene to evaluate different claims about why one family member is an elite distance runner when no one else in her family shares that trait. The final focus is on using evidence to support scientific claims and preparing for discussion and argumentation.
- **Advisory:** In Term 2, we transition our focus to the Community, centered on the themes of Optimism and Getting Along with Others. Students will move from managing their own feelings to understanding the feelings of those around them. Specifically, we will target the skills necessary to use positive communication to interact effectively with peers. A major focus will be placed on the "work" of friendship: how to develop and maintain positive relationships through active listening and empathy. Finally, students will be equipped with support for conflict resolution, learning how to navigate disagreements with a helpful, optimistic mindset that prioritizes solution-seeking over blame

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


YEARBOOK:
