



Naaman's Healing Craft



This simple craft depicts Naaman before and after his healing, with an emphasis on how his obedience to God brought about the healing. It is a fun way to help your children remember the importance of following God's directions. The face can be as minimal or elaborate as you like. Make it your own and have fun!

You will need:

- 1 paper plate
- Drawing utensils, such as markers or crayons
- Colored paper (any color)
- Glue stick
- Scissors

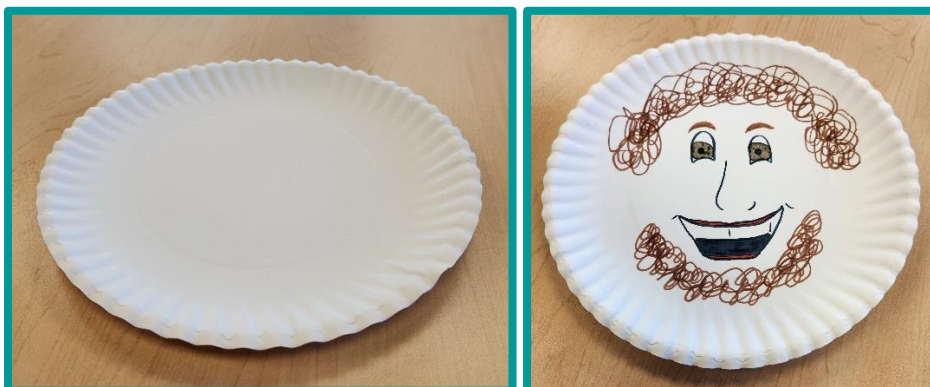




Place the paper plate upside down on the table and draw Naaman's sad face. The face can be simple or detailed, depending on the child's skill level and desire.



Take paper of any color and cut out leprosy spots. Glue the spots onto Naaman's face.



Flip the plate right side up. Draw Naaman's face again, but this time happy to show Naaman's joy after being healed.



As a reminder of how Naaman's healing came about through God's power after Naaman's obedience, consider adding a written summary of the story. Under the sad face, write, "Naaman had leprosy..." Under the happy face, write, "...But he followed God's instructions and was healed!"

Alternate possibilities:



Add a handle to Naaman's face by gluing or taping a popsicle stick to the bottom.

If your child enjoys a more interactive craft, cut two small circles in the plate instead of drawing eyes. Your child can then use the plate as a mask to reenact Naaman's healing.
