WHEN IS PRIDE MONTH 2023?

As a sub-holiday during Pride Month, Pride Day is celebrated on June 28. The day marks the date in history when the first pride march was held in New York City in 1970. However, different communities celebrate Pride Day on different days throughout June.

TRADITIONS FOR PRIDE MONTH

Pride Month is for everyone to embrace who they are and let the world know — in style! The rainbow aptly signifies the colourful activities and flavours of this month-long celebration. These include massive rallies, pride parades, parties, workshops, concerts, and countless more LGBTQ+ events to attract participants from all over. The Pride community takes huge pride in their movement, going all out for the festivities with elaborate costumes, makeup, and, of course, glitter — so that they sparkle for the whole world to see!

Commemorations and memorials are also held for members of the community who have lost their lives to hate crimes and HIV/AIDS. Campaigns and rallies aim to promote and preserve the history and well-being of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender community.

REP YOUR FLAG!

Grab a rainbow, bi, lesbian, pan, ace, or any other flag of your preference and wave it with pride! Each of the rainbow flag's original eight colours has a meaning: pink for sex, red for life, orange for healing, yellow for sun, green for nature, turquoise for magic, blue for peace, and purple for spirit. Don't have a flag? Then wear your colours on a T-shirt, a hairband, or on the laces in your shoes. You could even paint your face with the colours that represent you — be as creative as you like to show your support.

JOIN IN A PRIDE PARADE

Run, walk, skip, or dance in a pride parade. You don't need to identify as LGBTQ+ to attend a pride march. Everyone is welcome to show their support for gay rights and equality for all, so check out what's happening in your community and go join in the fun!

Chicken & New Potato Traybake

INGREDIENTS

- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 500g new potatoes
- 140g large pitted green olives
- 1 lemon, quartered
- 8 fresh bay leaves
- · 6 garlic cloves, unpeeled
- · 4 large chicken thighs
- · bag watercress or salad leaves, to serve



Instructions

STEP 1

Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Pour the olive oil into a large roasting tin and add the potatoes, olives, lemon quarters, bay leaves and garlic. Toss everything together so it's coated in oil and evenly distributed. Add the chicken thighs, skin-side up, and season.

STEP 2

Put the roasting tin in the oven and roast for 1 hr, basting with the pan juices halfway through cooking. After 1 hr, check that the potatoes are soft and the chicken is cooked through, then return to the oven for a final 15 mins to crisp the chicken skin.

June 2023 Events Celebrations & Special Days

Royal Cornwall Show 8 – 10 June Royal Cornwall Showground, Wadebridge

This three-day agricultural show is a calendar staple when it comes to Cornwall events. It's the county's biggest annual event, and whilst its focus is on food and farming, there's plenty to entertain as well! One of the best bits of the show is the Royal Cornwall Food and Farming Pavilion, show-casing a huge range of Cornish-grown and produced food and drink.

There are over 1,000 trade stands across the show, so you can pick up some fantastic items whilst supporting local businesses.

Along with livestock shows, Cornwall Cider Championships, and a flower show, expect exciting things from the Main Ring Entertainment. Look out for Taylors of Grampound on Saturday afternoon.

Falmouth International Sea Shanty Festival 16 – 18 June Venues across Falmouth

Cornwall plays host to a fair few sea shanty festivals throughout the year, but this one might just top them all. Falmouth International Sea Shanty Festival brings singers, musicians and sea shanty lovers from all over the UK and the world to the shores of Cornwall.

Following last year's 2022 return after two years off due to the pandemic, it's back once again in 2023. Last year there were more outdoor venues and larger stages than ever before, as well as more pop-up bars, activities, and performances.

The festival is totally free, and you can catch sea shanty performances in various venues across Falmouth. The whole festival is a celebration of all things nautical, set in a town built on the industry of fishing and the sea.

Cornwall Pride Events Dates 10 June – St Ives and Hayle Pride 17 June – Bodmin Pride

Cornwall has for a long time embraced Pride, but last year the South West region ramped up their events schedule.

To celebrate 50 years of Pride in the UK, Cornwall had 11 events take place across the county, rather than the usual singular Pride event in Newquay.

The added events were a complete success, with Pride bringing splashes of colour and LGBTQ+ joy to Falmouth, Camborne, St Austell, Saltash, St Ives, Bodmin, Bude, Penzance, Redruth, Newquay and Truro. Find all the dates for 2023's Pride events in Cornwall further below. Each location has a special theme, from 'celebrating Celtic culture' to 'supporting human rights and trans Pride'.

Best ways to save money from Which.

Transfer expensive credit card debt

If you're making large interest payments on credit card debt, it might make sense to move it all onto a 0% balance-transfer credit card deal.

These credit cards won't charge any interest on transferred debts for a set period, giving you the opportunity to make sure all your repayments go toward clearing the balance.

However, the interest tends to jump at the end of the promotional period, so make sure you pay off the balance in full before this happens.

Reduce your tax bill

You can keep hold of a bigger chunk of your earnings by claiming all the tax reliefs you're entitled to. The marriage allowance, rent-a-room relief and potentially exempt transfers (PETs), can all save you heaps of money, yet relatively few people are aware of them.

Recycle old clothes

These schemes all reward you for recycling old clothes:

- Marks and Spencer receive a £5 voucher (to be redeemed against a £35 shop) if you donate items to Oxfam (either clothing or soft furnishings). The clothes must not be damaged or soiled because they will be resold. You can also donate items in M&S stores under the retailer's 'Shwop' scheme you won't get a voucher but Sparks members get a free treat by scanning the QR code on the donation box.
- New Look take good-quality, pre-loved fashion to a Hospice charity shop, scan the QR code on the counter and receive 15% off your next shop at New Look.

Cancel unnecessary direct debits

A quick browse of your monthly statement can help prevent any unnecessary payments lasting for months or even years.

Get into the habit of logging into your online bank account once a month and making sure you're not shelling out for services you no longer need or use.

Save on prescriptions

In England, you may receive free prescriptions if you have a certain medical condition or disability, or if you're on certain benefits. Those that are under 16, between 16-18 in full-time education and over 60 also receive free prescriptions.

If you don't qualify for any of those you'll have to pay £9.65 per item, but you could save with a prescription prepayment certificate.

PPCs can be bought online via the NHS website. A three-month prepayment certificate currently costs £31.25 and a 12-month PPC will be £111.60
