What you can do

Want some tips to find out how you can reduce plastic waste? The good news is, anyone can get involved. You can start out small, or really challenge yourself!

Takeaway coffee cups

Most coffee cups aren't recycled. By bringing your own reusable coffee cup, or taking the time to dine-in at your favourite café, you can make a huge difference.

Plastic Free Cleaning

Many people are surprised how easy it can be to avoid cleaning products packaged in single-use plastic.

Plastic shopping bags

Plastic bags are incredibly dangerous to our wildlife and environment. Bring your own reusable bags and help put an end to this plastic waste.

Meat, fish & deli

Meat, fish and deli products are often sold on polystyrene trays; a type of plastic extremely difficult to recycle. It also contains chemicals that can be harmful to human health

Fruit & vegetables

Many grocery stores pre-package their fruit and vegetables in plastic, and offer plastic bags for loose items. There are simple alternatives to help reduce your impact on the environment.

Bacon & avocado warm pasta salad

INGREDIENTS

- 300g orzo
- 1 tbsp sunflower oil
- 140g streaky bacon, chopped
- 140g cherry tomatoes, halved
- ½ x 190g jar <u>pesto</u>
- 2 avocados, stoned, peeled and sliced
- 70g bag rocket
- · Grana Padano shavings, to serve



Instructions

STEP 1

Bring a large pan of water to the boil. Cook the orzo following pack instructions, drain and set aside. Meanwhile, heat the oil in a frying pan and fry the bacon for 4-5 mins until crispy. Stir in the tomatoes and cook for a couple mins more. Stir in the orzo, pesto and avocado, and heat for 2 mins more.

STEP 2

Spoon onto a serving plate, then scatter with rocket leaves and Grana Padano.

Recycled And Repurposed Garden Ideas

Gardening is a great way to connect with nature for your wellbeing, and it doesn't need to mean taking on a big project or spending lots of money – this activity recycles old boots into planters. Find yourself some old wellies or boots. Children's wellies work really well and this gardening project is ideal for when your kids grow out of theirs but don't want to part with them – you can't get more environmentally friendly than recycling old boots!



Wellies Planters

You will need:

Old wellies or walking boots

Organic peat-free compost

Screwdriver/drill or something to make holes in the bottom of the wellies with

Herb or flower seedlings (or seeds)

What to do:

- Take one pair of old wellies or boots; if they're worn to pieces and not suitable for hand-me-downs,
 they're perfect
 - Create drainage holes with a screwdriver, drill or other tool if they're not already holey enough
 - Fill with compost
 - Plant seeds or young plants in each welly boot
 - Water them, stand in a sunny spot and watch them grow!

These don't even require a garden, you can stand them on the doorstep/balcony or patio if you're short on outdoor space.



Tea Cup Bird Feeders.

Do you have a favourite old tea or coffee cup that was broken? Get out the hot glue gun, glue it back together (if it's not in a thousand pieces) and create a new bird feeder.

You will need a tea cup or coffee mug and a preferably corresponding colour/style saucer, Hot glue and a glue gun, some string or twine, and a bent spoon (optional).

How to drill a hole in a metal spoon:

- Use a hand clamp to clamp the spoon to a piece of wood. This will make it easier to punch an indentation in the spoon so you have a place to start drilling.
 - Use a small cobalt drill bit to drill the hole.


