# The Bloomberg Philanthropies Data for Health Initiative Global Grants Program Launches New Funding Round

#### Introduction

The Bloomberg Philanthropies Data for Health (D4H) Initiative Global Grants Program (GGP) is launching a new round of funding for projects that strengthen civil registration and vital statistics (CRVS) systems and enhance the use of high-quality data to inform public health policymaking.

## **Funding Details**

The GGP will support grant periods of 12-15 months with a maximum award amount of \$100,000. Shorter-term grants with lower award amounts are also encouraged. Sustainability measures must be incorporated into the project design. Applicants should plan to start their projects on or around April 1, 2026.

## **Eligible Applicants**

- Government agencies at the national, state/province, or municipal/urban level
- NGOs that have ongoing partnerships with government should write to <u>ggpinfo@vitalstrategies.org</u> to determine eligibility

## **Priority Areas**

Projects should focus on one of the following thematic areas:

- Strengthening CRVS Systems
  - Examples:
    - Improving governance and coordination of CRVS
    - Enhancing notification and registration of vital events
    - Implementing verbal autopsy
- Using Public Health Data for Policy and Planning Examples:
  - Integrating data sources to address priority health issues
  - Developing data reports to support policymaking
  - Publishing public health bulletins









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#### **Application Submission Process**

- 1. Project Idea Submission
  - Submit a concise project idea between October 27 and November 14, 2025, for initial screening.
- 2. Application Submission
  - Selected applicants will be invited to submit a full application, due by **December** 8, 2025. Only invited full applications will be considered for funding.
