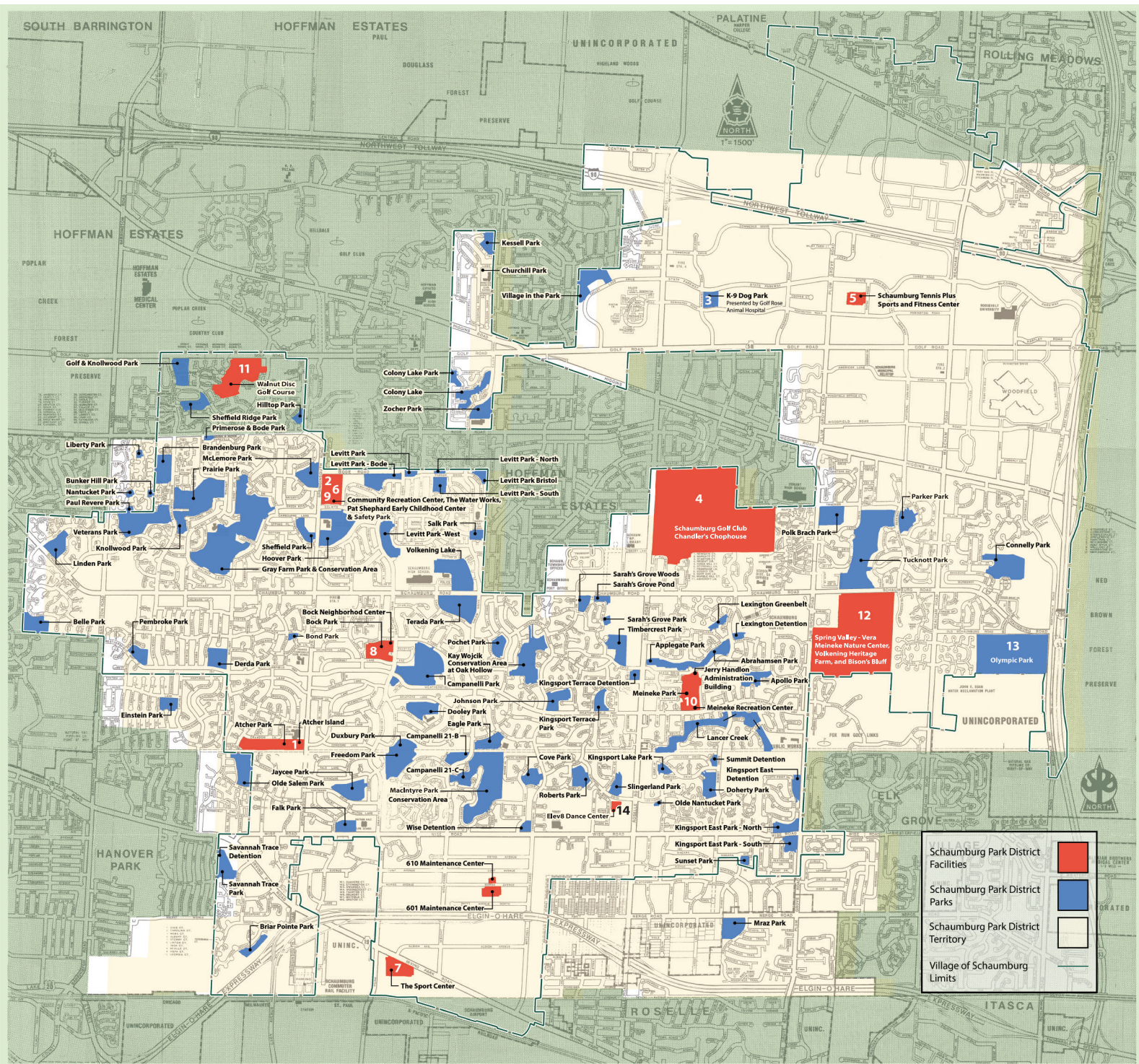

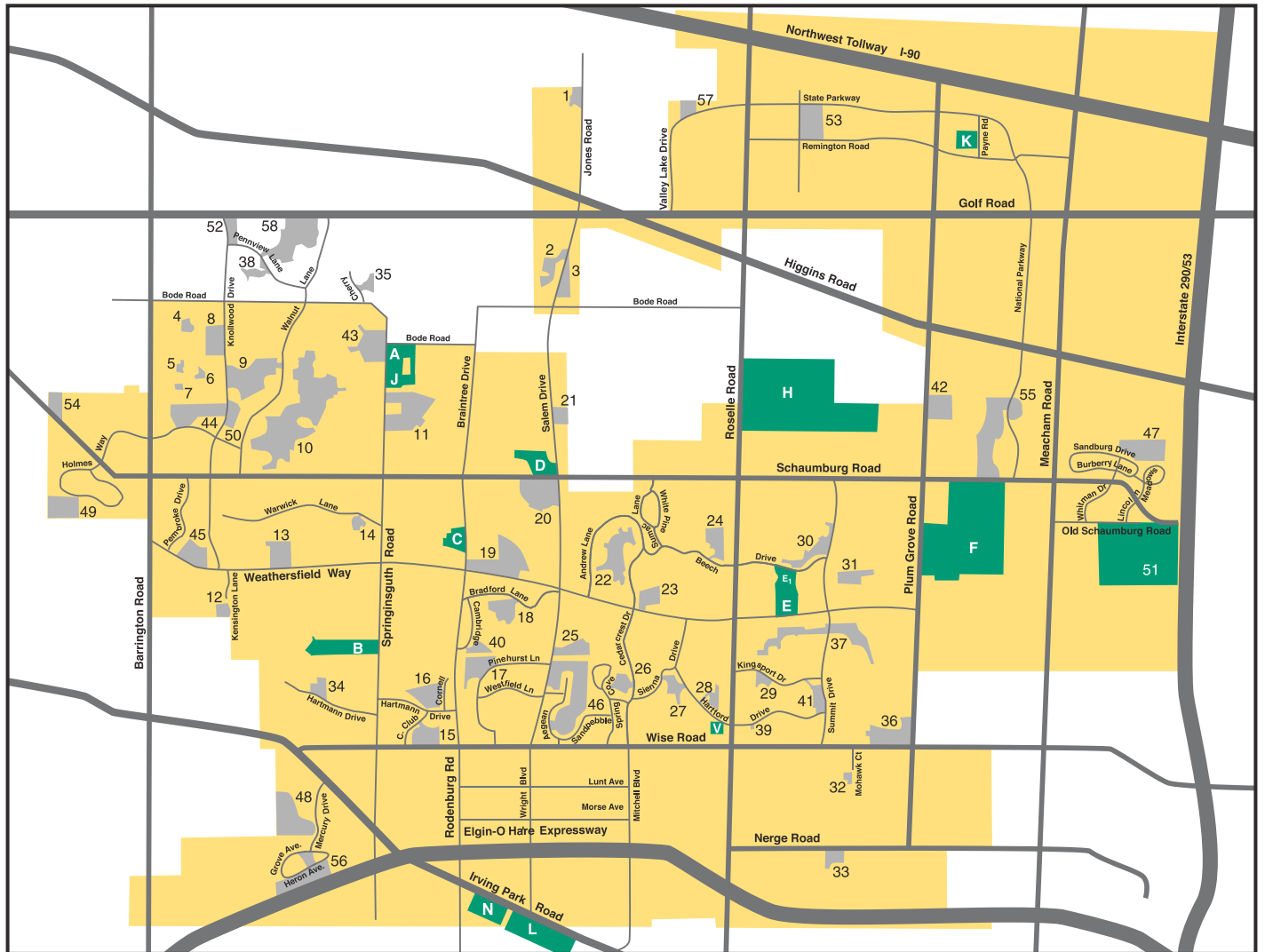

Park and Field Use Information

A park rental application is available at parkfun.com. Requests are filled on a first-come basis, depending on availability. Permit cost is \$200 for residents (includes \$100 deposit); \$300 for non-residents (includes \$150 deposit). All fees are due at the time of booking. Fee includes picnic tables at shelter sites. The Olympic Park rental application is located on the Olympic Park webpage, accessible from the Parks tab. Sports field rental fees vary based on the type of field, organization and residency. Allow two weeks for processing.

Certified Monarch Butterfly Waystations

Certified Monarch Waystations provide resources necessary for monarchs to produce successive generations and sustain their migration. All other pollinator plantings are noted in the table.

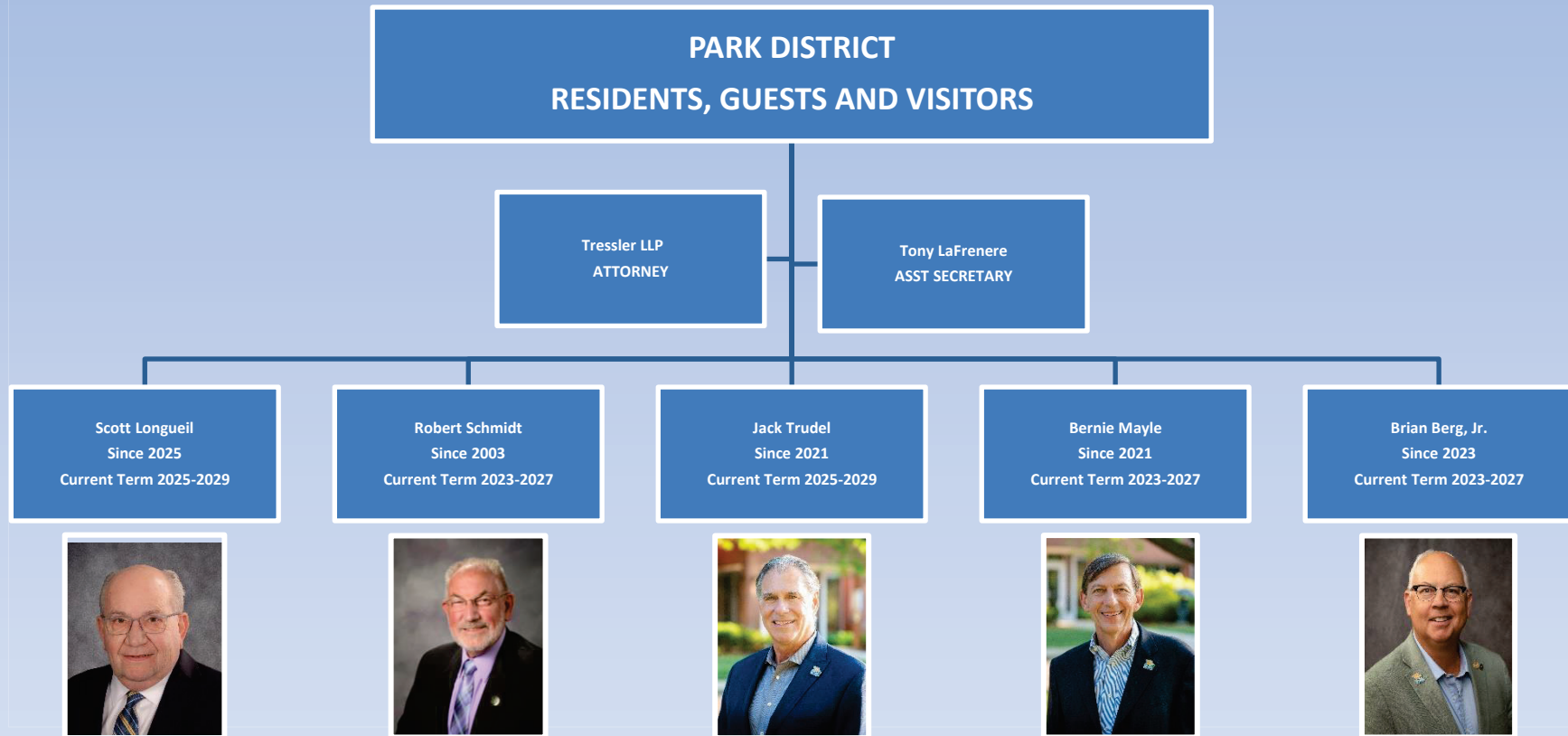

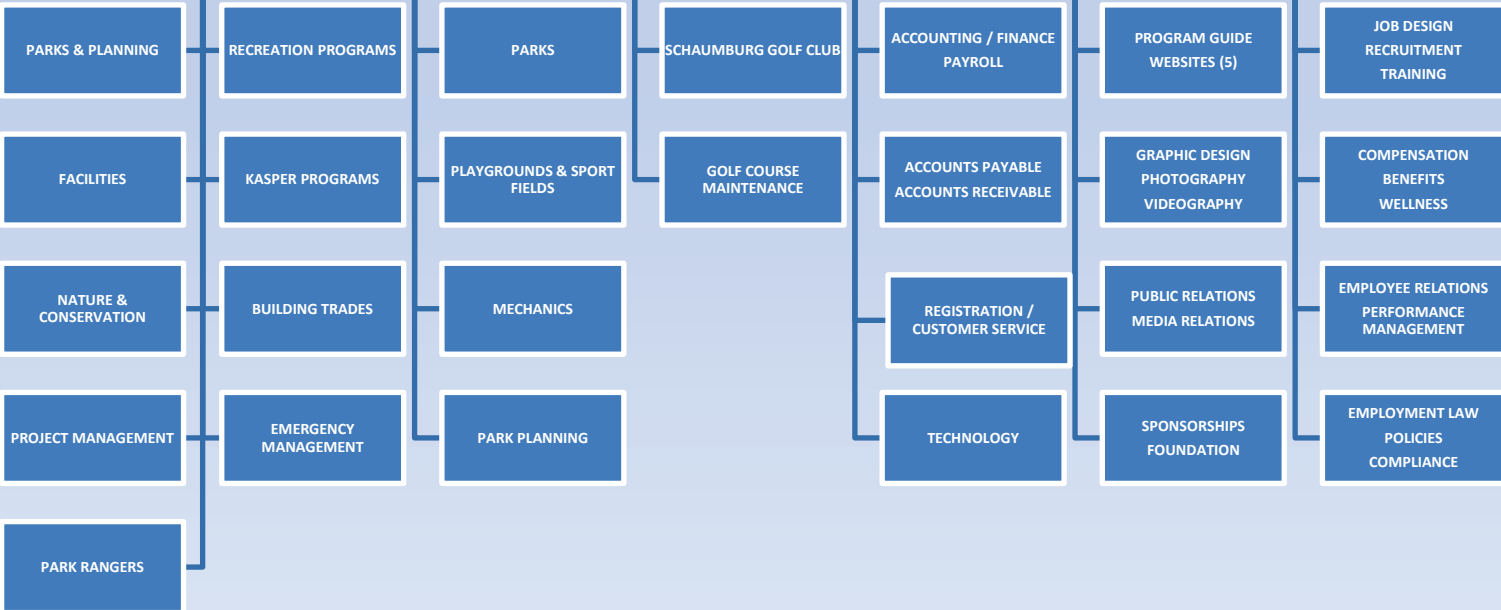

In accordance with the Freedom of Information Act, you will receive a response to your request within seven business days. If your request is denied, you may follow the appeals process outlined in the Illinois Freedom of Information Act.

You may choose to inspect or receive copies of the information requested. There is a fee of 15 cents per page after the first 50 pages, which are complimentary. There is no charge to view the information.

Freedom of Information requests may be made via email or in person at the Schaumburg Park District offices during normal business hours. The following types of records are generally available to the public.

Inspection:

- Approved minutes of Board and Committee meetings
- Budget and Appropriation Ordinance
- Resolutions and other ordinances approved by the Board
- Independent auditor's annual report
- Recreation programming initiatives

Customer Satisfaction
