Emerald Maldives Resort and Spa is a 5-star deluxe all-inclusive resort celebrated for its natural elegance and thoughtful design, blending tropical beauty with refined comfort. It's a proud member of The Leading Hotels of the World.

Set on a lush, 20-hectare private island surrounded by 1.5 km of pristine white-sand beach, the resort is a sanctuary of barefoot luxury and tranquility.

We have 120 eco-friendly villas, split between Beach and Overwater categories, crafted from natural materials and offering luxury amenities such as walk-in closets, indoor/outdoor showers, bathtubs for two, and high-speed Wi-Fi. Options range from family and jacuzzi villas to the expansive Royal Beach Villa and Presidential Water Villa.

Guests enjoy a Deluxe All-Inclusive culinary journey across dining venues, including buffets at Aqua, casual yet refined beachside dining at the Beach Club Grill, Latin-American flavors at Amazònico, Asian specialties with live Teppanyaki at Le Asiatique, and unwind with handcrafted drinks at Sunrise Café, and Sunset Pool Café.

The resort's Balinese-style Emerald Spa offers ten treatment rooms, a pool, sauna, Turkish baths, and Jacuzzi, while recreation includes snorkeling, diving, water sports, tennis, fitness facilities, and the Dolphin Club for children.

Energy "Powering Paradise, Efficiently"


At **Emerald Fasmendhoo Maldives**, energy conservation is central to our mission of reducing environmental impact while maintaining world-class hospitality.



Installed energy-efficient LED lighting and smart HVAC systems across all villas and public areas.



Implemented a "Green Hour" initiative, encouraging guests to minimize energy use during peak hours.




Fuel consumption in 2025 is generally higher than in 2024, reflecting increased occupancy. In several months, however, the rise in fuel use outpaces occupancy growth, suggesting additional strain from operational demands and reinforcing the importance of energy efficiency initiatives. On average, occupancy in 2025 is about 16% higher compared to 2024



CO² Emissions "Carbon Conscious Living"

Carbon emissions are the cause of climate change, which can have significant negative effects on both people and the environment. Carbon emissions raise global temperatures by storing solar energy in the atmosphere. This impacts water supplies, weather patterns, and poses a hazard to coastal communities due to rising sea levels in addition to altering the growing season for food crops. We install solar water heaters and use less diesel in an effort to mitigate the negative impacts because we are aware of our personal contribution to the global problem.

- Implementing novel renewable technology like solar water heaters to reduce CO² emissions and rely less on fossil fuels for energy.
- We have partnership with companies that recycle waste to reduce GHG emissions, specifically CO2 emissions by offsetting it.
- We use sensors in villas which switches off the HVAC of the villa once the gates are opened.




Our CO₂ emissions in 2025 remain higher compared to 2024, which directly relates to the increase in occupancy rates this year. As guest numbers rise, higher energy and resource consumption follows, leading to the observed increase in emissions. On average, occupancy in 2025 is about 16% higher compared to 2024

Water "Every Drop Counts"

Water conservation entails judicious use of the resource to reduce water waste. At **Emerald Maldives Resort and Spa**, we desalinate our own water, thus we don't take water from the municipal supply. We strive to use less water at the resort since we fully believe that safeguarding this natural resource is crucial for the ecosystem by installing low flow plumbing fixtures.



Water consumption in 2025 is higher compared to 2024, which aligns with the increase in occupancy rates. However, the rise in consumption slightly exceeds the growth in occupancy, suggesting greater per-guest water usage and highlighting the need for continued focus on water efficiency measures. On average, occupancy in 2025 is about 16% higher compared to 2024

Waste "Less Waste, More Paradise"

The management of solid waste is one of the Maldives' largest environmental challenges. We realize that running the resort on the remote island generates a lot of garbage, which is a big pollutant that's bad for the environment and for people's health. Because of this, we continuously work to reduce the negative effects by reducing, reusing, and recycling waste. The projects listed below aim to reduce trash production.

Since there is relatively little room for the dumping of solid waste in the Maldives, waste management presents a significant environmental concern. We monitor our trash generation to ensure that it doesn't significantly harm the environment or the general public's health. As a result, we constantly work to lessen the negative effects by reducing, reusing, and recycling waste products. We have reduced our waste generation this year as compared to last year with the help of ways to reuse organic waste.

Paperless

Emerald Maldives has partnered with Eleanor Enterprises
Ltd to launch an innovative mobile app that enhances both
guest and team experiences. The app serves as an
information hub, streamlining pre-arrival, check-in/out, and
bookings for restaurants, spa, activities, and excursions. By
enabling personalized itineraries and efficient operations, it
elevates the guest experience while reducing paper usage
and supporting sustainability.




Sustainability Green Card

In each villa, our Sustainability Board provides tips on supporting water and energy conservation and reducing chemical use. Heart of House Tour

Heart of House Tour, held every Thursday at 11:00hrs, offers guests a behind-the-scenes look in our resort's sustainability efforts. Participants explore key operational areas, including the Orchid Garden, Powerhouse, Water Desalination and Bottling Plant, Sea Waste Treatment Plant, and Laundry Area, learning how the resort conserves energy, manages water sustainably, and minimizes environmental impact. This immersive experience highlights our commitment to eco-friendly practices while giving guests a deeper understanding of resort operations.



Solar Water Heaters

Solar water heaters have been installed throughout the resort, including in staff areas and kitchens. This installation has reduced our total daily energy consumption by 20%.

Each villa is equipped with a 300-liter tank that collects and stores water during hot weather. During rainy periods, such as continuous rain for two days, the system can switch to an electrical heater as an option.

Glass Bottles

Emerald Maldives Resort and Spa endeavors to be ecofriendly and strives to protect the rich ecology of Maldives. The water in this bottle has been specially processed using the unique EcoPure Waters purification system. These bottles are reusable, saving our resort from disposing about 200,000 plastic bottles each year. We are serving these water bottles to guest villas, restaurants and bars



No Straw

As part of our sustainability commitment, we have implemented a No Straw policy for all guest drinks. Straws are available only upon request, helping reduce single-use plastics and protect marine life. We encourage guests to consider if a straw is necessary, as even small choices contribute to a healthier, more sustainable environment.



Dolphin Kids' Club

At Dolphin Kids' Club, we provide a fun and eco-friendly space for our young guests. Most toys are 90% plastic-free and made from natural wood, encouraging creativity while teaching sustainability. By minimizing plastic and using durable, eco-conscious materials, we inspire children to care for the environment as they play and explore.



Eco Herb Garden

Our newly introduced Eco Herb Garden is a sustainable initiative where we grow fresh herbs, fruits, and vegetables right here at the resort. This garden not only allows guests to see where some of their meals begin but also ensures that the produce served is as fresh, healthy, and organic as possible. It reflects our commitment to sustainability while offering a unique farm-to-table experience for our guests.

AC & Light Motion Control Sensor

All resort accommodations are equipped with energy-saving sensors that automatically turn off the AC when doors are opened and switch to a 26–27°C saving mode when rooms are vacant. Lights also turn off after 7 minutes of inactivity. This system reduces daily energy consumption by approximately 25%, achieving significant energy savings.



Food Compost Machine

In each villa, our Sustainability Board provides tips on supporting water and energy conservation and reducing chemical use. Guests are encouraged to turn off lights and air conditioning when not in use, take shorter showers, and participate in our Linen Reuse Program, which replaces towels and bed linens every other day. By adopting these simple eco-friendly practices, you help protect the environment while enjoying the luxury of our resort, contributing to the preservation of the Maldives for future generations.



Water-Saving Aerators

We have installed water-saving aerators in all our team members accommodations and resort outlets. In the team members accommodation showers, we've implemented aerators that reduce water flow from 12 liters per minute to 8 liters per min, achieving a 30% reduction. For the outlets & kitchen washbasins, the flow rate has been reduced from 5.2 liters per minute to 4.5 liters per min. These adjustments have resulted in 12% overall savings in water usage.



Waste Management Equipment

Glass Crusher, Woodchipper or Shredder
Our waste management system uses sustainable practices
and specialized equipment for recycling and reuse. Glass
bottles are crushed in a compactor and repurposed for
concrete and garden decoration, while green waste,
including trimmings and coconut husks, is shredded by our
wood chiller machine and used for fertilization and
landscaping.



Landscaping Garden Boards/Boxes

Emerald Maldives Resort and Spa endeavors to be ecofriendly and strives to protect the rich ecology of Maldives. The water in this bottle has been specially processed using the unique EcoPure Waters purification system. Recreation Lawn Grass - Timed Sprinkler

We use drip and sprinkler irrigation systems across the resort to reduce water waste and labor. For the 2023 garden project near Aqua, a shelf irrigation system was installed, while automatic sprinklers water the tennis courts and orchid garden twice daily, optimizing both water use and efficiency. The sprinklers activate twice a day—at 05:00hrs and 17:00hrs—helping to reduce both manpower and water usage.



Reusable STP Water Irrigation

We have an effective wastewater irrigation system known as the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP). This system collects all wastewater from the resort, including toilet and laundry waste. The wastewater is processed through the STP, and the treated water is then used for irrigation purposes. The treated water, a final product of STP, is applied to our landscaped gardens. Additionally, the waste sludge, which is a muddy then mixed with soil and used as fertilizer



Symphony of the Sea

It's a 30-minute presentation in Sunset Pool Café every
Fridays at 18:00hrs. Where our Marine Biologist talks about
corals, briefly introduce our location in the Maldives, and
highlight the reef fauna that can be seen while snorkeling,
including fish, dolphins, turtles, and sharks. On special
marine-related days, Our Marine Biologist may hold
dedicated presentations focusing on specific species, such
as manta rays.

Parley for the Oceans

We have signed a contract with an organization called Parley, which will collect and recycle or reuse all plastic PET bottles. However, we use very few plastic bottles, primarily for staff and select areas. Generally, the resort predominantly uses Emerald glass bottles, which are refillable and reusable, aligning with our sustainability goals.



Traditions & Culture in Maldives

Through our Cultural and Traditional Awareness Program, we share the rich heritage of the Maldives with our guests.

Highlights include the Traditions of Maldives-themed dinner at Aqua Restaurant, lively Boduberu performances at Sunset Pool Cafe, and turndown cards in villas featuring interesting facts about local history and customs. These experiences provide guests with a deeper connection to Maldivian culture, making their stay truly memorable.



VAMCO Maldives

We ensure that waste oil from our power generators and used cooking oil from the kitchen are properly managed and reused. We have a contract with a company based in Malé called VAMCO, which purchases the used black oil and cooking oil from us. VAMCO processes these oils in a sustainable manner that minimizes environmental impact.



Utilizing Local Ingredients

As part of our sustainability commitment, we use locally sourced ingredients and support Maldivian fishermen. By incorporating fresh, seasonal produce and seafood, we offer authentic flavors while reducing our carbon footprint and promoting sustainable fishing practices. These efforts benefit the environment, support the local community, and enhance the dining experience for our guests.

Fasmendhoo Nature Trail Quest

Emerald Fasmendhoo Island is not only a luxury retreat but also a lush sanctuary of tropical trees, flowering plants, and rare greenery. Guests can embark on the Fasmendhoo Nature Trail Quest, a unique island adventure that combines exploration, learning, and appreciation of the Maldivian ecosystem. Equipped with a Nature Explorer Booklet, participants discover 30 carefully tagged plant species, learning their common, scientific, and local Dhivehi names, while understanding their ecological role and cultural significance.



Local Students Visit

Our Local Students Visit Program educates young students about sustainability by offering a behind-the-scenes look at our eco-friendly practices. During their visit, students explore areas such as the Orchid Garden, Powerhouse, Water Desalination and Bottling Plants, Sea Waste Treatment Plant, and Laundry Area, learning how we conserve water and energy and reduce waste. The program aims to inspire the next generation to adopt sustainable habits and become advocates for a greener future.









Maduvvaree School - Children's Day 2025

Reef Protection

Waste Management

We aim to maximize the use of our compactor, glass crusher, and plastic shredder to enhance waste management practices, while exploring additional recycling opportunities by sending processed materials to approved vendors in Malé.



Guest Awareness

We plan to create engaging activities that involve guests in our sustainability initiatives, such as a Fasmendhoo Nature Trail Quest highlighting the island's unique flora.
