"Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Pather, in humility, value others above yourselves."



THIS PLACE IS HOME FOR ME Kristen Reinowski, PCS Teacher

Park Christian School is home to me. I began attending PCS as a fifth grader after my family moved to the FM area. As a student, I was challenged academically, grew in my relationships with others, but most importantly, I fell in love with Jesus. Park Christian School is a place where I was provided opportunities to deepen my walk with Jesus. Things like Junior High retreats, morning prayer meetings, worship nights, chapels, and service projects, alongside what I was learning at church and home, gave me a desire to know and pursue Jesus. I can remember one morning prayer meeting we met at school at 6:00am and walked through the halls, praying over each classroom and locker. We then met together to write out prayers, put them in tubes, and buried them at the four corners of the property, literally surrounding our building in prayer. This was a powerful thing to experience as a 17 year old, and to do it with my classmates and friends made it even more meaningful.

I also felt so loved and valued by my

teachers. We had a family emergency five days before graduation, and my government teacher stopped class to pray for me. I can remember meeting with a teacher in 8th grade to pray for a friend in my class who was struggling. My teachers knew me, and they always had time to talk with me to show they cared for me. I saw a love for Jesus modeled through them as they went about their daily lives. Spiritual growth didn't always come from the big events but also through watching people who loved Jesus live it out on a daily basis.

What a blessing it was to return to Park Christian four years after graduating to teach 2nd grade! I gained a whole new perspective of what God was doing and the privilege it is to be a part of this place. My first year teaching, I had a student that was struggling with anxiety over a coming tornado drill. He couldn't focus on what we were doing, so I had him pull out his Bible and read Psalm 34:4, "I sought the Lord and he answered me, he delivered me from all my fears." We got through the drill and

moved on to reading. As we opened our books to the story for the day, Psalm 34:4 was printed at the top of the page. He noticed it right away, and we both were in awe of God's sovereignty over that moment. That student came back to me during his high school years and told me that was his life verse. I have watched God answer the prayers of my students as we have prayed together for the Lord to provide funds for expansion projects and more students to experience the powerful educational experience Park has to offer. Some of my students started

praying for God to provide for our school during their recess time, and it was so fun for them to see God answer as we have been able to add on to the building and grow to over 600 students!

Now, I have the joy of being a Park Christian parent to a 3rd grader, 2nd grader, and kindergartener with two more children at home waiting their turn to be Falcons! It has been so fun to see my husband experience Park as a parent from worship at Back to School night, hearing the teachers pray over our kids at conferences, and listening to our kids share about all they are learning in their school day. We get to see the impact Park is having on our kids as they grow. My daughter was very concerned about some family members who don't know Jesus and had her class praying every day that she would have boldness to share Jesus with them. My son was singing every word to a worship song I hadn't heard before on the radio. I asked him how he knew it, and he said his teacher played it in his classroom during worktime. To see their hearts grow for prayer and worship moves me to tears. We are so thankful for how the values we are teaching them at home are being reinforced at school and that they are surrounded by more people who will point them to Jesus and love them well.

It's really hard to sum up the impact Park Christian School has had on my life. I am so grateful for the vision that began 45 years ago and touched through the giving and sacrifice of so many people.

This place is home for me.



Hello to my fellow Falcon family! My name is Josh Boyko, and I'm a 2021 alum of Park Christian School. I attended PCS from Pre-K all the way to senior year of high school, and even in the moments while attending PCS had a gratefulness for the environment I was brought up in. It truly is a privilege to be surrounded by like-minded, positive influences like teachers and peers growing up, all while doing it in a Christ-centered environment. There is no substitute for being in the Bible every day, and PCS enables students to do that from a young age.

Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old, he will not depart from it."

Christ-centered education is essential to providing children the ability to create a foundation. In Matthew 7, Jesus speaks of the two men that built their houses on the rock vs. the sand. One who lacks a foundation in worldview, in quality friendships, in relationship with God will not stand the storms of life the way someone that's built their house on the rock can. The storms fall on both houses in the parable as they do in each person's life, but one is prepared to withstand it and is not holding up the house himself. It's the Rock.

However, you can surround someone with positive influences, Christcentered academics, church and all the right things, but you still must make your faith and relationship with God your own. You can lead a horse to water but cannot make him drink. I encourage current students reading this to evaluate why you are at Park Christian on weekdays and church on weekends. Am I going because my parents have put me in this position, or am I going because I see the value in it and want to embrace it? I say this because you're living in the most influential years of your life right now; and young adult life, whether in college or elsewhere, will test your values and worldview. The storms will come in various forms. Difficult

decisions, evaluating friendships and relationships, temptations, death of family even. As grim as those worldly trials sound, we never bear them alone because Jesus states in John 16:33,

"I have told you these things that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world!"

In my personal experience, I attended a secular university where most students were not fellow believers, so it was my job to search for the community and the people that would build me up, not tear me down. Chi Alpha ministries played a large role in that when I was a student and still does with the friendships that have lasted beyond my college years.

Those that know me know that I eat, sleep, and breathe sports. In junior high I was provided with the opportunity to broadcast the Falcons basketball games and fell in love with it, calling Falcons sports for 5 years before graduating and earning a statelevel scholarship for best high-school broadcaster in Minnesota. I worked in the Campus News department, winning several team and individual awards at the Midwest Journalism Conference before graduating in December 2024 with my bachelor's degree in Broadcast Journalism and a minor in Sports Communications. God helped me approach the situation boldly and at peace, knowing He is working for my good as Romans 8:28 would say. I was granted my request and have been working full-time in the broadcasting industry for all of 9 months now and enjoying it to the fullest! This year I have the opportunity to broadcast many Park Christian games for YourLiveEvent, and it's been wonderful to return home to where it all began!
