# Thinking Biblically Living Out Discipleship Daily:

At Park Christian, discipleship isn't just taught — it's lived. This year, we've been celebrating how students reflect God's story through authentic relationships and Christ-centered habits. Our eight Discipleship Habits help students connect their personal callings to God's greater story.

# Elementary: Instant Encouragement, Lasting Impact

In our elementary classrooms, teachers and staff recognize students in the moment for living out discipleship habits — **Servant Working** (showing kindness), **Beauty Creating** (creating beauty), or **Community Building** (offering forgiveness).

Students receive a Discipleship Habits Sticker as a way of saying, "We see you living like Jesus." When a row is full of stickers earning a "bingo," they celebrate with pizza.

"It feels genuine — a natural and powerful way to affirm students as they live out God's story," shared one teacher.

This simple act helps students connect everyday actions to their faith in real, tangible ways.

### **Junior High & High School:**

In grades 7–12, teachers nominate students who demonstrate the month's discipleship habit. This month the focus is **Idolatry Discerning** — turning from distractions and placing hope in Christ. October's students:

- Isadora Slack known for her intentionality and integrity, living out her faith with a deep desire to honor Christ.
- Paige Castagna reflecting diligence, thoughtfulness, and a quiet heart that seeks after God.

## **A Community Growing Together**

This discipleship habit recognition isn't about reward — it's about reminding students that their faith matters in the small moments just as much as the big ones. It's about celebrating when they choose to live like Jesus — and encouraging them that they are part of God's story. We are so thankful for the way God is working in and through our

students, and for the teachers and staff who faithfully disciple them every day.

# Shining Bright for God: Miss Wibbels' First Grade Deep Hope

In **Miss Wibbels**' first grade classroom, a beautiful light shines — from the hearts of her students. Miss Wibbels' Deep Hope for her classroom is clear:

"My deep hope is that my 1st graders will know Jesus and shine His light with their words and actions."

This message isn't just a slogan on the wall — it's woven into everything she does. Rooted in the creation story, Miss Wibbels helps her students understand that God created the light and called it good. From that truth, she teaches them a powerful question: How are we bringing God's light to the world, and how are we reflecting Him for His kingdom?

One intentional and memorable way she reminds her students of this is through a gift of sunglasses! These aren't just a cute classroom accessory; they serve as a daily reminder to shine bright for Jesus. Matthew 5:16, Jesus says,

"Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven,"

Miss Wibbels challenges her students to live lives that reflect Christ's love and truth. **Image Reflecting.** 

Each day ends with a thoughtful reflection: "How did you shine bright today?"

Through this simple but meaningful question, students are encouraged to think about the impact of their words and actions. Miss Wibbles believes that even young hearts can be transformed by the light Christ has placed in them — and that they can bring that light to others.
