

A Letter From Our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

You may have noticed a patrol car and an officer in our parking lot when you drove up to Mass. We haven't received any threats, and we are in no more danger here than we have been every Sunday, or at any church throughout our land. However, as Habakkuk decries the



violence of his day, there is no denying our land is a bit out of control, and every church has a minuscule chance of some random act of violence. I have consulted several knowledgeable individuals in preventing or at least minimizing our exposure to such an event, and the unanimous and overriding recommendation is to have a police presence on the grounds.

Additional recommendations include locking our doors once Mass begins, especially the side doors, as entry there would be much more troublesome than at the rear. We will leave one main entry door unlocked with an usher to oversee entries once Mass begins. Ideally, we will have one of our parishioners who is or has been involved in law enforcement at that post, with special attention from the officer on patrol.

Furthermore, all of our Mass coordinators are female, and we have asked the Men's Club if they could provide a male to sit with their family in a designated pew, to address any non-threatening but irrational behavior that may arise.

Lastly, we would like to inform you all that the protocol for any such event is to exit the building in an orderly yet speedy manner. All doors are or will be equipped with emergency release so that they can be exited through, even while locked. If exit is not possible, we should cover in, under, or between the pews. If those options do not deter or protect against the actions of an intruder and aggression occurs against those who pose no threat to the intruder, we are advised to confront and overtake the individual.

Let me reiterate, there has been no specific threat or hint of danger directed towards STM. We are just as safe as before, and as any other church, school, or mall in our country today; these are simply some proactive steps I felt responsible for enacting, given the sad regression of our society.

Once again, I ask any parishioners with police, military, or especially medical training to contact our office, along with your preferred Mass time. Feel free to call me with any questions or suggestions.

Help Us Care for What Is Sacred

Each weekday or weekend, as we gather to celebrate the Eucharistic feast as a community, our altar is set with vessels and linens that honor the importance of the sacrament being celebrated. These vessels and linens—just like the fine china and special linens we bring out for holidays or important occasions in our homes—need to be handled and cleaned with care.

The vessels are cleaned as soon after Communion as possible by Eucharistic Ministers or other volunteers. However, the cleaning of the linens must be done off-site, as they require more time and care than can be given in the few minutes at the end of Mass.

Altar linens hold great significance in the Catholic Church because they are used in the sacred liturgy, where they come in contact with the Precious Body and Blood of Christ. Proper care, handling, and cleaning of these linens reflect reverence for the Eucharist and uphold the dignity of the Mass.

The linens that get the most use and need the most care are the purificators and the corporals.

- Purificators are used to wipe the chalices after each person receives the Precious Blood and may also be used to wipe crumbs of the Precious Body from the ciborium.
- The corporal is placed on the altar to catch any particles of the consecrated hosts that may break off or any drops of the Precious Blood that may be spilled as the vessels are moved.

With four Precious Blood stations at each weekend Mass, plus at least two at any weekday, funeral, or wedding Mass, we can go through up to 32 purificators in a week, with up to four corporals needing to be cleaned as well.

Volunteers are needed to help clean and press these linens in a timely manner, so we always have the necessary number of linens on hand for Mass.


Because these linens may contain particles of the Precious Body and Blood of Christ, they should not be washed with regular laundry. Specific instructions on the cleaning and care of Mass linens will be provided to all volunteers.

Volunteers should have access to:

- A container large enough to soak at least 10 purificators and a corporal
- A washing machine
- An iron

The Book of the Names of the Dead: A Tradition of Love and Remembrance

How deeply we long to have our loved ones beside us—especially after they have passed away. Our hearts yearn to express that longing in a tangible way. In her wisdom, the Church has given us a meaningful tradition: writing their names in a book and coming together as a community to pray for them.

We pray for the dead by name because a name carries the weight of identity and memory. It reminds us of who they were and evokes their presence in a way no single word can. While we might say someone was kind, funny, or generous, those descriptions fall short. A name, more than any adjective, captures the depth and uniqueness of a person—it comes closest to expressing the fullness of their life.

The names written in the book are far more than ink on a page—they reflect the people we hold in our minds and hearts. Each name calls to memory a life, a presence, a relationship. And when we see those names, we are moved to pray for them. We pray with hope that they now behold the light of God's face, and that they rejoice with the saints and angels in the heavenly Jerusalem.

One day, our names too will be written in the book by someone who carries our memory in their heart. When that moment comes, what memories will your name awaken?

Beginning October 12, the Book of the Names of the Dead will be placed in the church vestibule for parishioners to write the names of their beloved departed family members and friends. This year, we are using a new book, so we invite you to include the names of all deceased loved ones—not only those who have passed away in the past year.

As we near the sacred season of remembrance, let us honor those who have gone before us with our prayers, our love, and the simple yet powerful act of writing their names. In doing so, we affirm that they are not forgotten—they live on in our hearts, in our faith, and in the eternal presence of God.


