A Letter From Our Pastor

HUMILITY/MASS

Today's Gospel features the smug prayer of the Pharisee who essentially reminds God how lucky He is to have him on His team, contrasted by the tax collector who owns his sinfulness and pleads for mercy. Likewise, in our first reading, Sirach reminds us:



"...the prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds to reach the unseen throne of God."

Such prayers are heard because they come from the hearts of people who know how much they need God. Prosperity tends to lead us into a false sense of sufficiency - apart from God's grace and providence - whereas the poor know their next meal is dependent on God. Sometimes, our good deeds/pious works can also blind us to our spiritual deficiencies and need to engage more in building the Kingdom.

Speaking of humility, there is a bit of discord in our Church today over how we engage in praying our greatest prayer, our Mass! As with all changes, there have been those resistant and enamored with the mindset of the Church from six decades ago. (Such as altar rails, priest dress, forbidding female altar servers, etc.) There is even a group that has broken away and, to my understanding, seeks to undo the changes ushered in through Vatican II such as the Ordinary Form of Mass we have used for the past five and a half decades.

The history of our liturgy was the subject of our last retreat; presented by the highly respected Dr. Brant Pitre. Some of the key points I have room to share with you here are that our Popes have every bit of authority they need to alter our Mass and have done so dozens of times since the birth of our Church. Jesus said, "Do this in remembrance of Me" and gave us the words of consecration. EVERYTHING else is MAN-MADE, not Divinely revealed, and absolutely open to alterations.

The highly romanticized "Latin Rite" (Tridentine Mass) was only the accepted form of Mass for less than four of the Church's twenty centuries. There was great discord in the Church when the Latin language was introduced. "Only the Greek is sacred!" many protested. Also, singing many parts of the Mass in Latin remains completely acceptable and is preferred for special seasons such as Lent. Receiving in the hands is the original form of reception, and each of you can receive standing, kneeling, in the hands, or on the tongue. None of the positions are more reverent, pious, holy, or superior to the others. The Bishop gave us firm instructions that no more altar rails will be installed and insisted all priests say Mass facing the people.


Many who treasure parts of the Latin Rite feel we have lost reverence. Reverence is an internal mindset, but I would like to address a couple of changes that would surely increase our reverence. Mainly - quiet in the Church prior to Mass, so that people can pray! Ushers and ministers, your service is invaluable, and I'm so thankful for each of you, but please learn to whisper or step outside. Genuflecting prior to entering the pews and bowing before the tabernacle and prior to receiving communion is also essential. I'll post a refresher on reception of the Eucharist particulars later. God Bless!






Devotions, Explained!


