

A Letter From Our Deacon

THE BEATITUDES AND PARISH MINISTRY

Last week was Catholic Schools Week, a time to celebrate our largest ministry at St. Thomas More and, arguably, the largest ministry of our diocese.



Ministries in the Church have always been the lifeblood of the Body of Christ—His hands and feet—serving the faithful as He did. We are so blessed here at St. Thomas More to have so many ministries that serve God's people and meet them where they are. We have ministries that build our community life, others that evangelize to Catholics and non-Catholics alike, and still others that reach out to those in need: the poor, the shut-ins, and those who mourn.

In this week's Gospel, we hear Jesus giving His disciples the Beatitudes in His famous Sermon on the Mount. The Beatitudes outline the virtues required to be a citizen of the Kingdom of Heaven. As we serve others through the ministries of the Church, we are putting into practice the virtues that Jesus calls us to in the Beatitudes. Note the word "practice." None of us are perfect, but through our service, God makes our offering perfect.

We serve a righteous God who will always bless our work. Over my 40 years of working in various ministries in the different parishes where we lived, I can easily see where I have been comforted, repaid, satisfied, shown mercy, and experienced peace in my life because of that work. The Prayer of St. Francis says it so beautifully: "For it is in giving that we receive."

If you are not serving, I ask you to take it to prayer and ask God to show you where you can best serve. 
