PROBLEM



The use of overlapping platforms like Google Workspace and Microsoft 365 caused confusion and increased remote work made IT support difficult. Recognizing these issues, Cristo Rey partnered with Net Friends for a solution: Microsoft Endpoint Manager (MEM).





Structured Licensing: Implement group-based credentials, and establish tenant baseline settings in line with industry best practices.

Test Device Migration: Conduct a MEM migration test to ensure a seamless transition for all devices.

Implementation: A 22-step procedure to ensure the endpoints are correctly migrated and configured. A key part of this process was the implementation of stringent local administrative controls, further bolstering endpoint security.
