That's why we strongly support the bipartisan Building Civic Bridges Act (BCBA) H.R. 4329 and urge Congress to advance this vital legislation.

The bill would establish an Office of Civic Bridgebuilding within AmeriCorps, the federal volunteer program with a 30-year history of service to American communities. Research from SHRM shows that incivility costs U.S. businesses more than \$2 billion daily in lost productivity and absenteeism. The ripple effects are real and essential for long-term business success.

The BCBA is a timely and targeted investment in restoring the social fabric that supports both civic life and economic vitality. While there is no single solution to polarization, this legislation offers a practical path forward—one that strengthens the local organizations best equipped to foster dialogue, bridge divides, and build trust from the ground up. It's a smart starting point for tackling a challenge that touches every part of American life, including our workplaces.

We applaud the bill's bipartisan leadership and urge every member of Congress to support its passage in 2025. American businesses have much to gain from a stronger civic culture and much to lose if polarization continues unchecked. It's time to invest in solutions that rebuild trust, foster mutual respect, and strengthen the foundations of our democracy and economy.
