SPECIALTY CERTIFICATIONS

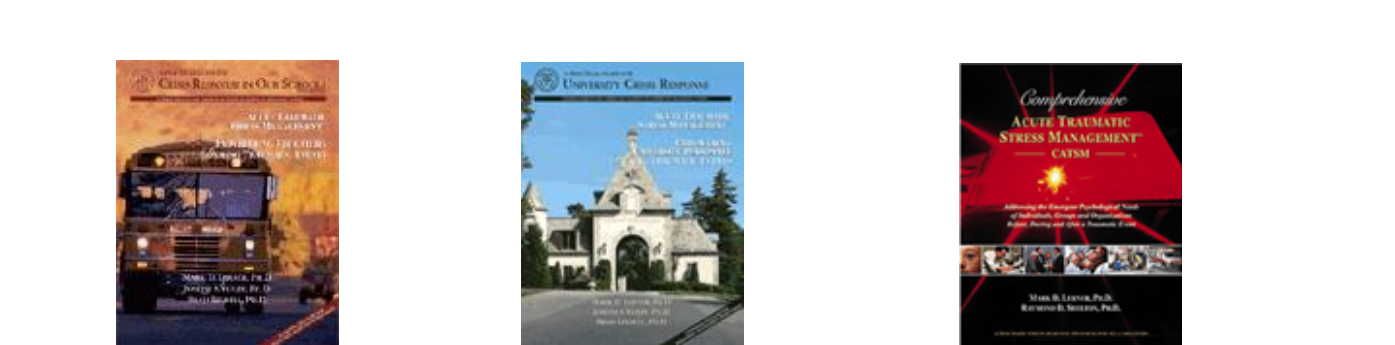
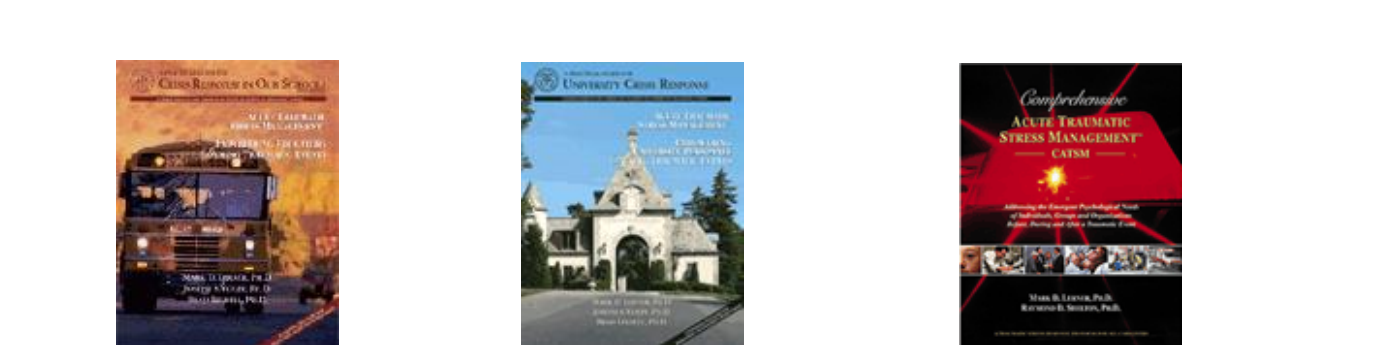

In these times of need, it is important for members to keep their professional contact and profile information updated since collaborating organizations will be utilizing the Registry in times of deployment to assist in addressing the needs of people impacted by traumatic events and crisis situations.

International Directory of Expert Witnesses of the American Academy of Experts in Traumatic Stress

The *International Directory of Expert Witnesses* allows those requiring expert testimony in the areas of traumatic stress and crisis management to review members' credentials on-line. 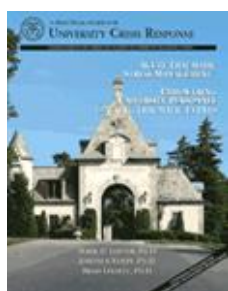
