SPECIALTY CERTIFICATIONS



The Registry includes professional information, such as office address, telephone number, specialty information, professional biography, languages spoken, awards received, affiliations and if applicable, insurances that are accepted. In these times of need, it is important for members to keep their professional contact and profile information updated since collaborating organizations will be utilizing the Registry in times of deployment to assist in addressing the needs of people impacted by traumatic events and crisis situations.

International Directory of Expert Witnesses of the American Academy of Experts in Traumatic Stress

The *International Directory of Expert Witnesses* allows those requiring expert testimony in the areas of traumatic stress and crisis management to review members' credentials on-line. The Academy's ultimate goal is to publicize the directory so it is the most utilized mechanism for the legal community when searching for expert witnesses in the areas of traumatic stress and crisis management. 
