Bear Valley Police Department update

As a reminder for our residents, Bear Valley Springs is a private, gated community, and that privacy is one of the key reasons people choose to live here. Controlled access at the gate, private roads, and limited public entry all contribute to a heightened sense of security and peace of mind. Our Public Safety team is committed to protecting those boundaries —whether through consistent gate protocols, active patrols, or discreetly addressing concerns that affect your daily life.

Because Bear Valley Springs is not a public area, our approach to law enforcement and community service is unique. From traffic stops to general service calls, we operate with the understanding that this is a self-governed, resident-funded community. Every interaction

reflects on our relationship with you, and we take that trust seriously.

Staffing Considerations and Operational Impact:

The Bear Valley Police Department continues to operate with limited staffing, which has had a measurable impact on response times and enforcement output. While calls for service rose from 82 in May to 90 in June, our average response time also increased from 5:05 to 6:30, indicating a direct strain on available resources. Despite these challenges, BVPD prioritizes in-progress Priority 1 and 2 calls during oncall hours, ensuring that urgent and potentially life-threatening situations receive immediate attention. Our goal is to focus

After months of planning and countless volunteer hours invested, Bear Valley Horsemen's Day of the Horse event came to life on June 28, at the BVS Equestrian Center.

Featuring an art show, the Mane Event arena full of horses, and the Club Corral for kids and their parents to learn and create, the event was, by all measures, a big success. Extra fun was had by guests who visited Carriage Hill for a ride in a horse-drawn vehicle, the chance to watch a farrier (horse podiatrist!) put new steel shoes on different horses, and time to visit Cowtown, where modern-day wranglers demonstrated their cattle-handling techniques.

Each of Bear Valley's seven equestrian clubs participated in Day of the Horse by setting up fun and educational booths and contributing to the Mane Event demonstration rides. Envisioned and managed by the BVS Horsemen's Association, the morning event drew more than 500 visitors, from horsemen to new residents, children to long-time equestrians.

Equine demonstrations included a pa-

triotic flag presentation, Pony Club's terrific drill team, sessions with gaited horses, young horses, English riding and dressage, introduction to roping, Liberty basics, driving, mounted shooting, and more. These demo sessions were followed by the Parade of Breeds: short showcases featuring 18 different equines who live in Bear Valley.

While horses were performing in the arena, kids also enjoyed decorating horseshoes, learning leather craft basics, how to handle a lasso, designing their own cattle brand, handling the reins of a pony cart, and more in the Club Corral area.

BVS Horsemen's thanks the many volunteers, equestrians, club members, and their teams who made this first-time event one of Bear Valley's biggest gatherings of the year. Special thanks to David Feibush, our announcer and MC who kept everything moving on schedule while educating and entertaining the crowds. Additional thanks to BVS Cultural Arts for helping with our "Life with Horses" art show, and the support and encouragement of BVSA.



Bear Valley CSD Public Works update: Roads Department

The month of June was a busy one for the Community Services District's roads department! Over 127 tons of asphalt were used to overlay roads, seal cracks, and fix potholes. That's an increase from 100 tons used in May. A big shoutout goes to the General Services Department for their work on the CSD's drag box, which allowed the roads department to complete the overlay work.

Significant effort has also been dedicated to roadside mowing and weed abatement. Most of Deertrail Dr. has been mowed, with remaining sections scheduled for July. Additional areas maintained include Skyline Dr., Lower Valley Rd., and Cumberland Rd.

The roads team also completed routine street sweeping, sign maintenance, pavement marking, and erosion control in June. Seasonal temporary workers played a crucial role in these efforts, especially in supporting traffic control for large projects. Without their assistance, regular crews would be limited to just two workers for such tasks, severely impacting productivity.

We appreciate the community's patience and support as we continue these vital improvements across our roadways.

ment as we get into our summer months. The team also did their regular monthly manual meter reading.

Do you know your evacuation zone?

On July 8, the Bear Valley Police Department and Bear Valley Community Services District teamed up with the Kern County Fire Department and other local partners to host a Wildfire Evacuation Tabletop Exercise. During the exercise, an important question came up — do Bear Valley residents know their evacuation zones?

Kern County uses an emergency management tool called Genasys Protect to help manage evacuations. For emergency response purposes, Kern is divided into hundreds of zones. When a wildfire or other emergency occurs, residents in a specific zone may be instructed to shelter in place, seek a refuge point, or evacuate. This system helps emergency officials coordinate disaster responses more effectively.

Bear Valley is divided into several evacuation zones. To find your zone:

- Visit https://protect.genasys.
- Enter your address
- Write down your zone and keep it somewhere easy to find
- You can also download the "Genasys Protect" app for access on your mobile devices.

Emergency officials will reference zone names in alerts to let residents know which areas are affected.

We also recommend keeping copies of local evacuation routes and refuge points handy. For your convenience, we've included them here.



The club does much more than set up telescopes at the




Club tour of Big Bear Solar Observatory



on community safety.

To mitigate these impacts, the department is:

- Leveraging our Volunteers in Policing (VIPs) program for non-enforcement functions.
- Reassigning administrative staff to support field operations when feasible.
- Adopting sign-on bonuses to improve recruitment competitiveness and attract qualified applicants.

Until staffing levels return to operational norms, BVPD will continue to prioritize calls based on priority, maintaining our commitment to community safety more than anything else.
