

As Lucy Pet evolved, David was tasked as guardian and overseer of "Surfin' Jack" the official mascot of Lucy Pet. Surfin' Jack was 10 hours from being euthanized when someone spotted her and she soon became part of the Lucy Pet story. David and Jack traveled across the US, visiting pet stores and conferences from California to Florida. Surfin' Jack soon became the star of the



show, travelling with the Lucy Pet "Wave Machine" and was in a couple of Rose Parades. Most recently, David and Surfin' Jack did store demos at multiple Big 5 stores, including Tehachapi, and a couple of commercials. Surfin' Jack is now retired and living the good life that she deserves in BVS with David and the household of Aussies.

David, now in sales and business promotion, has shifted focus and is on the road doing demos and sales at dog shows throughout the state and occasionally out





## **Astronomy Club's visit to Griffith Observatory**

The Astronomy Club was recently treated to a fascinating behind-the-scenes tour of the remarkably historic Griffith Observatory. Our knowledgeable guide was Geo Somoza who is both a longtime tour guide and telescope operator at the observatory. The observatory and planetarium opened in 1935, funded and gifted to the City of Los Angeles by the industrialist Griffith J. Griffith to make astronomy available to everyone after being inspired by a visit to the Mt Wilson Ob-

servatory.

Geo not only explained the observatory's incredible exhibits but also pointed out details that might easily be missed by the general public. For example, the walkway leading to the lower level is precisely aligned north-south to create a solar transit calendar. Each day, as the Sun crosses local noon, its image is projected down onto a metal strip that shows the date and constellation that the Sun currently occupies.

Geo made sure that we got

to see all the highlights like the Foucault Pendulum in the Central Rotunda and even switched on their awesome ~500,000 volt Tesla Coil to show us how it shoots lightning-like bolts many feet in every direction! Along with these "greatest hits," Geo also took us into some areas most don't get to see like the interior of their 12" Zeiss refractor telescope dome. This was of particular interest to those of us with a lot of experience with telescopes.

The tour was concluded

with a planetarium show that utilized their updated, computer-controlled Zeiss star projector. The show was wonderfully narrated and walked us through the history of astronomical knowledge from the ancients up to our current era of space-born telescopes.

All of us who made the trek had a superb time. Griffith is only about a 2-1/2 hour drive, making it an easy and highly recommended day trip.



# Understanding the July 2025 fish die off at Four Island Lake

In mid-July 2025, Four Island Lake experienced a significant Benthic Fish Die-Off, with approximately 5,740 pounds of fish lost over three days. While this was far less than the 15,000 pounds removed during winter, it still underscored the lake's ongoing ecological challenges. Dissolved oxygen levels dropped to zero throughout the entire water column, leaving aquatic life without the oxygen needed to survive. This was triggered by a combination of hot weather, calm conditions, and the breakdown of organic material on the lakebed-a situation made worse by a continued overpopulation of bullhead catfish. More oxygen-sensitive species like bass, bluegill, red-eared sunfish, and golden shiners were the most affected. Importantly, the fish die-off was not attributed to an algae bloom.

Thanks to a rapid response within 30 minutes of the first report, staff and volunteers quickly mobilized. Over 242 man-hours were dedicated to cleanup, with fish removal totals of 3,410 pounds on day one, 1,730 on day two, and 600 on day three. Some reproductive-sized desirable fish were relocated to Seventh Hole Pond for future restocking. The lake was closed for only two days, minimizing disruption to residents and recreation.

Since 2020, Bear Valley Springs Association Lake Quality Advisory Committee working with Mountain View

Consulting Group—has implemented long-term improvements, including aeration, nutrient control, harmful algae treatments, and the removal of over 80,000 pounds of bullhead catfish. Recommendations for continued lake improvement include expanding aeration capacity, dredging to reduce oxygen-demanding sediment, and continuing aggressive population control of bullhead catfish to restore balance and protect more desirable game fish.

A sincere thank you goes out to the dedicated volunteers and staff who worked tirelessly during the cleanup effort. Special appreciation to the Mulligan Room for generously providing a great lunch for all volunteers on the first day—keeping everyone fueled for the hard work ahead.



### PROPOSED CHANGES TO BVSA RULES

### **TEXT OF PROPOSED BVSA RULE CHANGES**

(Deletions are shown in strikethrough type and additions in **bold underlined** type)

### SECTION 1802. FEES AND DEPOSITS

- (a)(1) Except as expressly provided otherwise in this Article, all Special Users of an Amenity or common area shall be charged a rental fee, in an amount to be established by the Board, for the purpose of at least partially reimbursing the Association for the estimated overhead and administrative costs incurred by the Association because of the Special Use of the amenity, including, but not limited to, utilities and payroll costs. A Special User and/or commercial user that is otherwise subject to the rental fee may receive an exemption from this fee for an event if a significant percentage of the net revenue derived from the event will be used in Bear Valley Springs to contribute to the social, welfare, educational or recreational activities or interests of Association Members. The request for exemption must be in written form, addressed to the General Manager and include the net revenue from the event and the amount and purpose of the revenue that will be used in Bear Valley Springs. Approval or denial of the request will be at the discretion of the General Manager and the Board of Directors, who will so indicate their decision on the original request, which will be returned to the Special User, a copy of the request and disposition will be filed with the Association Secretary. (*Amended 6/5/24*)
  - (2) Recognized Clubs shall be permitted to make Special Use of amenities and common areas and receive an exemption from a rental and/or commercial fee for an event <u>at an amenity location</u> if a significant percentage of the net revenue derived from the event will be used in Bear Valley Springs to contribute to the social, welfare, educational or recreational activities or interests of Association Members.
  - (3) A fee schedule, established by the General Manager (or Board of Directors) will be applied for use of BVSA equipment by Recognized Clubs. that The applicable fee schedule applies when or if BVSA staff must erect or transport or if equipment is removed from BVSA storage location. Equipment includings but not limited to: tables, chairs, BBQ's and tents. Outside vendors, when utilized, shall have all appropriate health department certificates, insurance that indemnifies BVSA and signed release of liability.

    (Amended 02-10-11, 6/5/24)
- (b) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this Article, all Special Users of an amenity must, at the time of submitting the required Special Use Request and Agreement, deposit with the Association a cleaning and repair deposit in a reasonable amount established by the Board. If the Special User leaves the amenity as clean and in the same condition and state of repair as existed prior to the Special Use, the deposit will be refunded. The deposit shall be forfeited to the Association if any cleaning or repair is required.
  - (2) Repetitive Special Users may elect to have monies remain on deposit during the term of their reservations, which may not exceed twelve months.
    - (3) Recognized Clubs will be exempt from the cleaning and repair deposit requirement so long as the Club leaves the amenity or common area in a clean and good condition.
- (c) (1) All Commercial Users must pay, in addition to the rental fee required under

  1802(a), a fee not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the Commercial User's net revenue derived or attributable to the

  Commercial User's use of the amenity or common area. This fee shall be due and payable to the Association promptly

  (but no later than two business days) after the end of the Commercial User's use of the amenity or common area.
  - (2) The Association reserves the right to inspect and audit the books and records of any Commercial User at any reasonable time to verify the gross revenue and the amount of the fee to be paid. (*Amended 6/5/24*)

### SECTION 2400. GENERAL RULES

(a) Hours of operation are established by BVSA Management and may be changed without prior notice.



- (b) Every person using the Bear Valley Nature Path and Cub Lake Walking Path must possess a valid BVSA Use-Privilege Card, BVSA Guest Amenity Use Pass, or be accompanied by someone with an appropriate card or pass. Amenity Use Privilege Card or BVSA Guest Amenity Use Pass must be presented upon request by a BVS Ranger or BVS Management.
- (c) Parking must be at Beaubien Field or Cub Lake designated parking areas.
- (d) Users of Bear Valley Nature Path and Cub Lake Walking Path must remain on approved and posted path.
- (e) The following motorized vehicles are prohibited on the Bear Valley Nature Path and Cub Lake Walking Path; Type 3 e-bikes, mopeds, gas-powered motor bikes, quads, dune buggies, and other similar equipment and devices. (Ref: KC Ordinance 09-230 and BVCSD Code 6-3-6].
- (f) Bicycles, including Type 1 and Type 2 commercially made e-bikes, <u>and Golf Carts</u> are permitted on the Bear Valley Nature Path and Cub Lake Walking Path. Upon request by a BVS Ranger or BVS Management, identification of the type and wattage of e-bike as indicated by the manufacturer label must be shown by cyclist. Maximum MPH for any of the above <u>mechanized vehicles</u> is 2 <u>1</u>0 miles per hour and riders must abide by the conduct rules as outlined in Section 2401.
- (g) Baby strollers, roller skates, children's toys and scooters (human-powered or battery operated up to 24 volts) and mobility scooters are permitted on the Bear Valley Nature Path and Cub Lake Walking Path and must abide by the conduct rules as outlined in Section 2401.
