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A LETTER FROM PASTOR TOM

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I once helped a friend move into an old house. As he peeled back layers of wallpaper, he found himself drawn into the story of that place: rooms where generations before him had gathered, eaten, cried, and prayed. He talked about the privilege of living there and raising his own family in a home that had already held so much life, all while knowing his own season would be just one chapter in a story that would continue long after he's gone.

In a similar way, for well over a century, God has been at work on South Broad Street—building, sustaining, and growing a vibrant, multigenerational family of faith to reach across our town and our world with His love.

Like our personal lives, the life of a church is rarely linear. Seasons of challenge and seasons of opportunity both serve a purpose: to prepare us for where God is leading us next. Just as past generations were invited to step out in faith and build the foundation on which we now stand, we are being invited to consider the opportunity of our generation.

This is what MORE is all about.

MORE is not first about a project. It is a spiritual invitation—a call to make room for God in our hearts, in our lives, and in our life together, so that more people can be known, welcomed, and find their hope in Christ.

This is a significant moment for our church. We are welcoming more people through our doors than ever before, and more of us are encountering people far from God in our families, neighborhoods, schools, and workplaces every day. Just as those before us built stained glass windows, food pantries, Sunday School classrooms, and steeples, this is our moment. How will we respond?

As you read this booklet, I encourage you to do so slowly and prayerfully. Read with gratitude for what God has already done, with hope for what He may be preparing next, and with anticipation for how each of us—how you—can be part of it. This is a moment to listen, to trust, and to walk forward in faith together.

“Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine...” (Ephesians 3:20)

That is our hope. The God who has been faithful to St. John's will be faithful still.

At St. John's, we are trusting God for **MORE**—not only in what He will do through expanded space, but in what He longs to do within us as His people.

Our primary goal in the MORE campaign is **100% engagement**: that every person in our church family would prayerfully and faithfully engage this season by asking what it looks like to make room for God, for others, and for the future He is shaping among us.

This is not about equal gifts, but about a shared posture of discipleship. MORE invites each of us—no matter our age, background, or season of life—to take our next step in following Jesus with open hearts, open lives, and open hands.



MAKING ROOM FOR GOD

We begin where the Church has always begun: with worship, prayer, and trust. Before we make room in our building, we seek to make room in our lives—centering our days around God's presence, Word, and grace. This is a return to the rhythms that form us: listening before acting, surrender before striving, faith before outcomes.

MAKING ROOM FOR OTHERS

Because we have been welcomed by God, we practice lives of hospitality and generosity. Making room for others means shaping our lives—and our shared spaces—so people can be known, loved, and drawn into authentic community. Our generosity becomes an expression of the grace we ourselves have received.

MAKING ROOM FOR THE FUTURE

We do not build for ourselves alone. We build for children, students, families, and neighbors we may never meet—trusting that God uses our faithfulness today to bless generations to come. This is legacy-shaped generosity, rooted in hope rather than fear.

We invite every person at St. John's to discern their next step in giving—not out of pressure, but as an act of worship and trust. When the whole church moves together, God forms us together. And when we live generously, we participate in the life God is already unfolding among us.

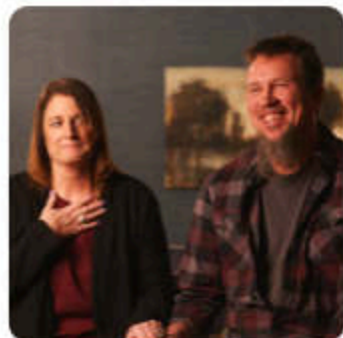

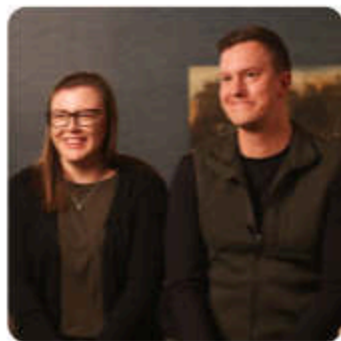

Our desire is not equal gifts, but a shared spirit of faithfulness. Each step of generosity—whether beginning or growing—is part of following Jesus with open hands, grateful hearts, and confident trust in the God who is always faithful.

At St. John's, we believe giving is an act of worship—a grateful response to God's grace and goodness. Everything we have comes from God, and generosity is one of the ways we align our hearts and lives with His purposes.

Each week, we are reminded that giving flows from three simple movements of faith:

GRATITUDE

We give in thanksgiving for all God has done for us, acknowledging that our lives and resources are gifts we receive, not achievements we earn.

STEWARDSHIP

We give because we have been entrusted with what we have. God invites us to faithfully manage our time, talents, and resources in ways that serve His mission and reflect His love.

TRUST

We give as an expression of trust, believing that God will continue to provide for our needs. Generosity helps form our hearts to rely on God rather than on what we possess.

As you pray and discern how God would ask you to give during this time, use this gift chart as a discipleship tool—let it be something that inspires and challenges you toward greater generosity for Christ's Kingdom as we seek to give it all for Him.

BEYOND CASH GIVING

For some, participation in the MORE campaign may include gifts beyond regular income. God has entrusted many of us with resources that, in certain seasons, can be used in meaningful ways to support His work.

Beyond-cash gifts may include appreciated assets such as stocks, retirement distributions, property, or personal assets like vehicles, boats, or collections. For many, these gifts represent a thoughtful way to turn stored resources into active ministry. If you are prayerfully considering a gift of this kind, our leadership team is available to help guide the process.

LIFESTYLE CHANGES

Others, generosity may grow through everyday choices rather than large assets. Creating room sometimes means adjusting priorities or timelines for a season.

This might include delaying a purchase, redirecting expenses that have run their course, or simplifying spending in small but consistent ways. These decisions are not about sacrifice for its own sake, but about intention—making space to trust God more deeply and to participate together in what He is doing.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



WHAT SPECIFICALLY IS PLANNED IN THIS PROJECT?

MORE is a vision for making room—for worship, for welcome, for community, and for the next generation. This first step of \$800,000 moves us toward that larger vision by expanding the spaces in our current church building for worship and fellowship. The larger vision will also include the eventual renovation of the recently acquired Geneva Street building.

WHEN WILL THE NEW BUILDING ON GENEVA STREET BE RENOVATED?

Geneva Street is part of the vision, but it comes next. Once we complete this initial step, we will begin making plans to transform that building into dedicated space for the next generation, community ministry, and church administrative offices.



WHAT IS THE TOTAL COST OF THE FULL VISION?

The full vision would cost approximately \$2.2 million in today's dollars. The first step of \$800,000 is part of that larger vision, not an amount separate from it. Any funds raised beyond this first goal will be used to move forward on additional parts of the vision, including the Geneva Street renovation. Future costs will be determined closer to the time of construction.

IS MORE JUST A BUILDING CAMPAIGN?

No. MORE is first a season of spiritual formation—making room in our hearts and lives so that more people can experience God's grace. The building expansion serves that larger purpose.

WHY EXPAND NOW?

God has been steadily growing St. John's, and our current spaces are limiting our ability to welcome, disciple, and gather people across generations. This expansion prepares us to serve both those here now and those still to come.

HOW LONG IS THE MORE CAMPAIGN?

MORE is a two-year spiritual formation initiative, inviting prayerful discernment, consistent generosity, and shared commitment over time rather than one-time giving purpose.



WILL RESERVE FUNDS OR BORROWING ALSO BE USED TO HELP ACCOMPLISH THIS VISION?

Yes. In addition to our first step of \$800,000, we anticipate using approximately \$200,000–\$300,000 from reserve funds and/or modest borrowing. This would provide up to \$1.2 million for the initial scope of work.

WHAT IF I'M NEW OR NOT READY TO GIVE?

You are welcome here. MORE invites 100% engagement, not equal giving. Prayer, participation, and discernment are meaningful ways to engage as you take your next step.

WHAT HAPPENS TO OUR REGULAR GIVING DURING MORE?

Regular giving continues to support the ongoing ministry of St. John's, while gifts toward MORE help fund the expansion that supports our future mission.

WHAT IF I CAN'T GIVE A LARGE FINANCIAL GIFT?

Every gift matters. Faithfulness is measured by trust and obedience, not by amount. Each person is invited to respond as God leads.

HOW WILL DECISIONS AND FUNDS BE HANDLED?

Church leadership and congregation council will oversee the project with prayer, care, and accountability, stewarding resources wisely and transparently.

HOW CAN I BE PART OF MORE BEYOND GIVING?

Pray for wisdom and unity, participate in worship and community, invite others, and trust that God is at work through our shared life together.

WEEK 4 - MAY 3

Generosity joins us in God's work. When we give, we participate in His mission in the world. And that is why giving is ultimately a spiritual decision, not a financial one.

We are not equal in amount, but equal in surrender. God does not want something from us; He desires to shape our hearts through trust, gratitude, and shared participation in His grace.

BUILDING FOCUS:

Spaces for the Community

GROUP DISCUSSION

PREPARE

Pray together this week's breath prayer:

Inhale: God who loves Exhale: May I make room for you

Share how you completed the journaling prompt at the end of this past weekend's worship service.

Icebreaker: What parts of your life feel crowded? Why?

RECEIVE

Slowly and prayerfully, read **Ephesians 3:14–21** two times. Begin and end each reading with a few moments of silence. In the silence, pray asking the Holy Spirit to guide you into living what you are to receive from the Scriptures.

REFLECT

1. What words or phrases stand out most to you in this prayer? Why do you think they caught your attention?

2. In verses 14–15, Paul says he kneels before the Father. What does this posture communicate? Have you ever changed your posture when you prayed? Why or why not?

3. What specific things does Paul pray that followers of Jesus would receive? Make a list from the passage.

4. In verse 16, Paul prays that believers would be "strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being." What is the difference between inner strength and outward success?

5. Paul prays that believers would grasp the "width and length and height and depth" of Christ's love (verse 18). Why do you think Paul emphasizes the vastness of Christ's love?

6. According to verse 19, what does it mean to be "filled to the measure of all the fullness of God"?

7. When you hear the phrase "God can do more than we ask or imagine," what comes to mind from your own life right now? For St. John's?

8. How does viewing giving as worship (rather than obligation) change your posture toward generosity?

9. As you prayerfully review your financial patterns this week, what might "trusting God more" look like in a concrete next step? Are you aware of what percentage of your income you give or tithe?

REFOCUS

As you wrap up your group time this week, go around and pray for the person on your right that as a result of experiencing MORE their faith would exhibit "immeasurably more than we ask or think".

Respond throughout this week by **Making Room for God**.

•Take 5 minutes this week to sit with God in silence with this request: "God show me how I can create space for you in my life so others can have MORE." And then journal what you hear.

•Reflecting on the Commitment Card, ask God to help you discern how you might generously make room so others might have MORE.

FAMILY TABLE TALK

Each week these questions and experiences are provided for you to flourish as a family. Use them to guide your conversations at dinner through the week.

Head: What does it mean to "make room" for God in our lives before we make room in a building?

Heart: When do you feel most peaceful or close to God?

Hands: Brainstorm a few ways our family could create space for God this week? (Like praying together, resting from busy schedules, or giving something to help others. What else can you dream up)?

Generosity: Why do you think giving to God is part of worship? What could it look like for our family to trust God with what we have?

GROUP DISCUSSION

PREPARE

Pray together this week's breath prayer:

Inhale: May my heart Exhale: Be open to others

Share how you completed the journaling prompt at the end of this past weekend's worship service.

Icebreaker: Think about a time you were invited to something meaningful (a wedding, holiday, special event). What made that invitation feel important?

RECEIVE

Slowly and prayerfully, read **Luke 14:15-24** two times. Begin and end each reading with a few moments of silence. In the silence, pray asking the Holy Spirit to guide you into living what you are to receive from the Scriptures.

REFLECT

1. What reasons do the invited guests give for not attending the banquet? What stands out to you about their excuses?

2. What are some modern-day "excuses" that keep people from responding to God's invitation?

3. What actions does the host take to make sure the house is full (verse 21-23)?

4. In verse 21, the servant is told to bring in "the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame." What does this reveal about who belongs in God's kingdom?

5. The host says, "so that my house will be full." What do you think that phrase reveals about God's heart for the church?

6. Which character do you relate to most right now:

- Someone making excuses?
- Someone already at the table?
- Someone being invited?
- Someone sent to invite others?

7. How might creating MORE space (physically or relationally) help people who feel overlooked, disconnected, or spiritually hungry?

8. Imagine someone new walking into church because of this MORE initiative. What would you hope they experience?

9. The banquet required preparation, resources, and intentionality from the host. How does generosity play a role in making room for others?

REFOCUS

Close by praying:

- For people in your life who aren't connected to Jesus yet.
- For courage to invite others.
- For hearts that reflect God's desire for a full house.
- For God to do MORE than we expect through this season.

Respond throughout this week by **Opening Your Life**.

•Take 5 minutes this week to sit with God in silence with this request: "How may my heart...Be open to others"? And then journal what you hear.

•Extend hospitality to someone by asking them to coffee or a meal just to hear more of their story.

•Reflecting on the Commitment Card, ask God to help you discern how your heart might be open to help others experience MORE.

FAMILY TABLE TALK

Each week these questions and experiences are provided for you to flourish as a family. Use them to guide your conversations at dinner through the week.

Head: In the Bible story, why was it important that the host kept inviting people to the banquet?

Heart: How does it feel when someone welcomes you or includes you? How do you think others feel when we include them?

Hands: Who is one person we could invite, encourage, or show kindness to this week (a friend, neighbor, or someone at church or school)?

Generosity: How can we use what God has given us (our home, food, money, time) to help others feel welcome?

GROUP DISCUSSION

PREPARE

Pray together this week's breath prayer:

Inhale: God across generations Exhale: May I live for MORE

Share how you completed the journaling prompt at the end of this past weekend's worship service.

Icebreaker: Who has had the biggest spiritual influence on your life? What did they do that made faith real to you?

RECEIVE

Slowly and prayerfully, read **Deuteronomy 6:4–9** two times. Begin and end each reading with a few moments of silence. In the silence, pray asking the Holy Spirit to guide you into living what you are to receive from the Scriptures.

REFLECT

1. As you reflect on the MORE Commitment Sunday, how is God stretching/challenging you? Where are you finding joy and excitement? What do you see the Spirit doing in the life of St. John's?

2. Verse 4 begins, "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one." Why does faith formation begin with remembering who God is?

3. What does it mean to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, and strength" (verse 5)? How is that different from partial commitment?

4. Verse 6 says these commandments are to be "on your hearts." What is the difference between faith on your lips and faith on your heart?

5. In verse 7, Moses commands parents to impress these truths on their children in everyday life. What does this teach about where faith formation happens? Give examples of how this can be done today?

6. What do the physical reminders (binding them, writing them on doorframes) teach us about embodied faith?

7. This passage is about legacy. How does a church's ministry space impact future generations' ability to know God?

8. Think about children, students, and families not yet part of the church. What responsibility do we have toward them?

9. What motivates people to give toward something they may never personally benefit from?

10. How does determining how much I give, reflect what I value?

REFOCUS

Close by Praying together:

- That God would help us love Him with our whole lives.
- For children and students in the church.
- For future generations who will encounter Jesus because of our faith filled generosity during this season of MORE.

Respond throughout this week by **Prioritizing God's Kingdom**.

•Take 5 minutes this week to sit with God in silence with this request: "God across generations, how may I live for MORE?" And then journal what you hear.

•Reflecting on the Commitment Card, ask God to help you discern how you might generously contribute so future generations can have MORE.

FAMILY TABLE TALK

Each week these questions and experiences are provided for you to flourish as a family. Use them to guide your conversations at dinner through the week.

Head: Why do you think God tells families to teach children about stories of the faithful again and again?

Heart: Who is someone older than you that has helped you learn about God or life? What do you appreciate about them?

Hands: What is one way you could connect with someone from a different generation this week (write a note, ask a question, help a grandparent, talk to someone at church)?

Generosity: How can giving today help people in the future learn about Jesus?

GROUP DISCUSSION

PREPARE

Pray together this week's breath prayer:

Inhale: Extend Christ's love Exhale: Through our generosity

Share how you completed the journaling prompt at the end of this past weekend's worship service.

Icebreaker: Describe the most generous person you know. What is it about them that makes them generous?

RECEIVE

Slowly and prayerfully, read **Luke 10:30–37** two times. Begin and end each reading with a few moments of silence. In the silence, pray asking the Holy Spirit to guide you into living what you are to receive from the Scriptures.

REFLECT

1. How does serving others change the way you see the church's mission?

2. The priest and Levite both "passed by on the other side." What might have motivated their avoidance?

3. What does the Samaritan's response cost him? Was it worth it?

4. Jesus ends with "Go and do likewise." What does that command require of us?

5. In what ways do service and generosity work together as participating in God's compassion?

6. What does this parable teach us about what it means to truly love our neighbor?

7. The priest and Levite likely had reasons for passing by. What are common reasons people today avoid getting involved in the needs of others?

8. Count up the action verbs from the Samaritan to the person in need. Which step is hardest for you? Which come easier? Why?

- Seeing needs
- Feeling compassion
- Taking action
- Sacrificing resources

9. Jesus ends by saying, "Go and do likewise." What might that look like for you and St. John's during this season of MORE?

REFOCUS

As you close this time as a group, in light of this past week being Commitment Sunday, slowly and prayerfully read **2 Corinthians 8:1-12** two times. Begin and end each reading with a few moments of silence. In the silence, ask the Holy Spirit to help you discern intentional ways you can pray for MORE. Share these ideas as a group and then use them to bring to a close these past four weeks but also use them as prayer leads over the next two years.

Respond throughout this week by **Surrendering**.

•Take 5 minutes this week to sit with God in silence with this request: "God show me how I can surrender my life, my time, my talents and my resources to You so others might have MORE." And then journal what you hear.

•Using the Commitment Card, ask God to help you discern how you might generously extend Christ's love to experience MORE.

FAMILY TABLE TALK

Each week these questions and experiences are provided for you to flourish as a family. Use them to guide your conversations at dinner through the week.

Head: What does it mean to "make room" for God in our lives before we make room in a building?

Heart: When do you feel most peaceful or close to God?

Hands: Brainstorm a few ways our family could create space for God this week? (Like praying together, resting from busy schedules, or giving something to help others. What else can you dream up?)

Generosity: Why do you think giving to God is part of worship? What could it look like for our family to trust God with what we have?



A FINAL INVITATION



MORE is not simply about what we are building—it's about who we are becoming.

God has been faithfully shaping St. John's for generations, and we believe this moment is part of that long story. The spaces we create today will help form lives, nurture faith, and welcome people we have not yet met. What we are doing now is an act of trust—believing that God is already at work ahead of us.

This season invites us to ask a simple but meaningful question:

What does it look like for me to make room?

Room for God. Room for others. Room for the future.

TRUSTING GOD'S PROVISION
