A Word from Jonathan:

Our short Gospel reading this morning only makes one point. We should put first in our lives the contemplation of Christ, before any duty or sentiment.

Jesus says to Martha that she is distracted by many things. Perhaps some of these were more than the domestic tasks she wishes Mary would assist with. Mary, whom Jesus describes as having `chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her.'

The time we live in today has been described as the 'Age of Distraction.' We spend an inordinate amount of time on the internet. Many of us find the internet indispensable when it comes to work. When we get home, we jump on social media or watch You Tube clips or Netflix. The internet is our great necessity and drug, all in one. It teaches us to hop from one sound bite to another. We have the attention spans of gnats.

We are provided with instant (and very short-sighted) solutions to complex problems that render us open to poor thought patterns, and poor decisions. Is it any wonder that American politics has become what it is?

But there is a solution. It is in spending time in God's Word in contemplative prayer. Not rushing but learning to listen to God. It takes effort, discipline and patience; and it is our life blood as Christians.
