#### **A Word from Jonathan**

Gaza Update from The Anglican Diocese of Jerusalem In the strongest possible terms, we condemn the attack by Israeli forces on the Al Ahli Hospital in Gaza (June 2025), killing three journalists and a father bringing his son for treatment. We call upon the leaders of the international community to enforce the combatant's adherence to the Fourth Geneva Convention with respect to protection for hospitals, medical personnel, journalists and civilians in general. We bid Christians and others of goodwill around the world to join us in continued prayers and efforts to bring a speedy end to this situation and a lasting peace in our Beloved Holy Land. (The hospital, which has been attacked several times by Israeli forces is part of the Anglican mission in Gaza, open to all residents, with specialist care for cancer patients and dates back to 1882 as part of Anglican Mission)
