

### **A Word from Jonathan**

The difficulty with thinking, "I've got to be a good example," is it's almost always more difficult than simply following a good example oneself and thereby being one by default. We are created to follow God's example, and that comes more naturally and easily.

In following God, without realizing it, we become an example for people who might be watching us. Imitation, it is said, is the sincerest form of flattery, but it turns out it is also the best way of setting an example for others: as long as we're imitating God, of course.

St Paul suggested others imitate him, because he was imitating Jesus. The idea of being an example is a bit daunting until we realize that God simply expects us to follow Jesus. That way we don't need to be concerned as to whether we are setting a good example or not.

There is a term that (disgracefully) has become increasingly used in our times: gangstalking. It refers to the targeting of an individual by any number of nefarious people. How wonderful if we could turn that on its head, and instead, set an example of being a group of people who focus on imitating Jesus, a people who target others with his love. The ripple effect of that activity would change the world.
