# **A Word from Jonathan**

A world that turns its back on God soon faces disruption, indeed chaos. It's easy, as a Christian, to get obsessed with order and stability as an antidote to instability. But, as any gardener will tell you, creating beauty takes a lot of activity that appears to be unlike the end product. There's nothing glamorous about improving soil quality, but it's essential. The journey should not be confused with the destination.

Similarly, it has taken many years for me to accept the foundational truth that we normally grow through unglamorous adversity. Unless we are challenged in our faith, we stagnate.

Here's a challenge for today. When God tells us we need to change, most of us think that means adjusting to a new structure, or a new liturgical approach, or a new role or duty. In short, we think God wants greater commitment. Actually, God is less interested in the outward manifestations of our faith, than he is in us. God wants us; lock, stock and barrel. What might that mean to you today?

Association in the orphanages across the former Soviet Union nations around Christmastime and throughout the year.

The project is called Immanuel's Child CHRISTMAS outreach. These celebrations have brought great joy to many children, as they have been given individual

Christmas gifts and Bibles. With each gift, they are also presented with a signed Bethlehem star, which represents someone who has committed to pray for them. With this personal gift, along with hearing the Good News of the Gospel, many are coming to repentance and faith in Jesus Christ.

You will have an opportunity to get a Bethlehem Star Ornament where you could write your name if you choose to support this outreach. The stars will be sent out on Monday the  $15^{\rm th}$  of December in order to get to the SGA team in time for January (Russian Orthodox Christmas) when they travel around orphanages.
