

## W.E.B Du Bois Sculpture Unveiling

From The Berkshire Edge - W.E.B. Du Bois comes home to Great Barrington: Sculpture unveiled at Mason Library

Great Barrington — It was a historic day for the town as hundreds of people honored W.E.B. Du Bois at the event to unveil his sculpture at Mason Public Library on Saturday, July 19.

Du Bois was born in Great Barrington on February 23, 1868, and was a historian, sociologist, and civil rights activist with global influence. He was a co-founder of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) in 1909 and was also the editor of the NAACP's journal, The Crisis.



The sculpture was unveiled at the event by Du Bois' great-grandson Jeffrey Alan Peck, who is on the board of directors for the W.E.B. Du Bois Museum Foundation. The goal of the foundation is to build a museum based on Du Bois' legacy and his teachings by 2028 in Accra, Ghana, where he died in 1963.

"When I first came to this town in 2014, I had no idea that I would fall in love with it and all the people in it, and that it would mean so much to me now," Peck said at the event. "When I travel around the world, the first thing that I bring light to is this town where Du Bois first opened his eyes."

"The significance of this event is that we need to uplift my great-grandfather's radical commitment to justice," Peck told the audience. "We should be inspired by his courage at a time like this. What [made] Du Bois rare then and now is that he courageously

represented his convictions. In the spirit of Du Bois, may we model the same kind of courage as he did."

Peck proceeded to read a quote from Du Bois right before he unveiled the sculpture, which was taken from the speech "On the Future of the American Negro": "We should measure the prosperity of a nation not by the number of millionaires but by the absence of poverty, the prevalence of health, the efficiency of public schools, and the number of people who can and do read worthwhile books."


Located on 316 Main Street, Eileen Fisher is the newest retailor to join to join the district.

OtherWords, is a monthly poetry reading series that takes place at he Mason Library.

Curated by poets <u>Michael Gottlieb</u> and <u>Evelyn Reilly</u>, *OtherWord*s is a continuation of the series that was hosted at the Familiar Trees Bookstore and RA Gallery on Railroad Street for the past two years.

The July poetry reading features Joe Elliot, Mitch Highfill, and Douglas Rothschild.

<u>Joe Elliot</u> is the author most recently of An Everything, as well as Idea for a B Movie, Homework, If It Rained Here (a collaboration with Julie Harrison) and Opposable Thumb. For many years, Joe made a living as a letterpress printer. He teaches English and lives in Brooklyn.

Mitch Highfill also lives in Brooklyn, on a beautiful out-of-the-way street that has both sun and quiet. He has edited Red Weather and the Poetry Project Newsletter and is the author of eight books, including No Precautions, Liquid Affairs, Turn, The Blue Dahlia, Koenig's and Five.

<u>Douglas Rothschild</u>, currently resident in Albany, is a poet, teacher, polymath, and handyman. For many years Douglas co-curated The Zinc Bar reading series in New York City. His books include Cud, lit/writ 103 & Critical Theory: An Appendage, The Minor Arcana, Match Book and Theogony

### **Guild of Berkshire Artists**

Water, Water Everywhere - From mundane to majestic the varied work in the July show at Art on Main's gallery will delight you showcasing the work of five artists.

Artist Peggy Reeves was inspired to rework a piece from 2004 when she took her photography class along the banks of the Housatonic River. Using paper made at the then local Rising Paper Company, they made cyanotypes (light sensitive blueprints) that they processed in the river. She has revisited the pieces, "finding new ways of enlarging the narrative".

Painter Pat Hogan made images with cold wax and encaustic. "I like the way the cold wax floats over the waxy encaustic surface like water. It evokes, for me, an enticing yet foreboding invitation to slip into the mysterious depths."

Black and white images are presented by photographer Bruce Panock. Drawn to Asian influences, abstraction, and black and white, these sweeping images take an abstract look at the ocean off Cape Cod.



Ceramic sculptor Moira O'Grady is inspired by the fleeting shapes and colors of water, as well as by what dwells within it. She combines sculpture, wood cutting, and painterly techniques with underglazing and glazing combinations.

Long a landscape painter, Marilyn Orner loves water for its fluidity, reflective qualities, and distortions. In this show, along with more conventional landscapes, there is also a melting popsicle, and swimmers in a pool.

Opportunities & Resources for Orgs – July 2025

Live Theater Tax Credit Pilot Program - will award up to \$7 million a year in tax credits for live theater productions in Massachusetts. Deadline: August 26th, 2025 at 5pm.

National Association of Realtors' Placemaking Grants - fund state and local REALTOR® association-led projects that create new, outdoor public

gathering spaces and destinations in a community on unused or underused sites. Applications accepted through October 15t, 2025, or until commitment levels reach 100%.

Trust for Public Land's On Common Ground Grant - supports parks and public space projects to foster social connection and bridge community divides. They are accepting proposals for community engagement projects that help community members connect across lines of difference. Deadline: Rolling.

### MassDevelopment's Brownfields Redevelopment Fund Rolling Round

Program - finances the environmental assessment and remediation of brownfield sites in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Eligible applicants include community development corporations, nonprofit organizations, EDICs, and municipalities and their agencies for publicly owned sites with an identified developer. Awards of up to \$250,000 in site assessment funding, and/or up to \$750,000 in remediation funding are available. Learn more about the application. Deadline: Rolling.

Artist Opportunities for August and September 2025

### Corning Museum of Glass Black, Indigenous, & People of Color Residency -

This residency is an extension of The Studio's Artist in Residency program. Through this dedicated residency, the Museum aims to welcome underrepresented artists while actively fostering a culture and community of inclusion that promotes, respects, and celebrates diversity. Artists spend five weeks at The Studio exploring new directions in glassmaking or expanding on their current bodes of work while suing the immense resources of the world's leading glass museum.

Deadline: August 31st, 2025.

Alterwork Residency - This residency was designed to allow emerging contemporary artists time and space to create new work exploring their practice. Artists may submit a proposal of how they intend to utilize the space as a studio to create new work or a specific project. The residency will culminate in a solo closing reception that is promoted across our extensive network. Proposals should have a contemporary art focus showing experimentation and career reach for the artist. We are especially interested in projects that involve conceptual art, practice or theory or involve the public in their creative process.
