



Half Rats Wine Bar - Half Rats Wine Bar is a natural wine bar located at 343 Main Street. The project is the creation of longtime local and hospitality veteran Abby Pendergist, who built Half Rats from the ground up in the former Berkshire Community College building, recently redeveloped by Alander. With help from a devoted crew of friends, neighbors, and skilled volunteers, Abby has transformed the space into something entirely personal. The name Half Rats, a nod to Victorian-era British slang for being slightly tipsy, speaks to the laid-back spirit she's built into the place: unfussy, warm, and a little wonky. The space is inspired by the neighborhood bars Abby encountered in her travels through Europe; small, personal spaces where people of all kinds gather. Indigo Room Grand Opening!

Great Barrington, Mass.—The Mahaiwe Performing Arts Center will hold a Grand Opening Celebration for its new performance space the Indigo Room from October 10th through October 12th, with performances by jazz vocalist Ann Hampton Callaway, blues guitarist Guy Davis, and family-friendly musician Terry A La Berry, among ceremonial festivities throughout the weekend. Further programming for the Indigo Room is also announced.

The Indigo Room is a flexible performance space in the former Great Barrington firehouse building at 20 Castle Street, next door to the historic Mahaiwe theater.

Seating in the Indigo Room is modular, allowing different audience capacities based on the nature of a program. About 80 patrons fit in an arrangement of café tables; 100 in plain rows; and 150 when standing-room-only. These seating plans can be customized in various combinations, such as with plain rows behind café tables in front.



"The Mahaiwe team is thrilled to celebrate the opening of the Indigo Room," says Mahaiwe Executive Director Janis Martinson. "Over the weekend we will demonstrate exactly what the Indigo Room will be: a versatile performance space with a true range of offerings. Between comedy, cabaret, blues, family fun and more, we hope to appeal to all entertainment appetites in our community. Come toast this new cultural hub in downtown Great Barrington!"

Rewind and Rediscover - History of Searles Castle

Searles Castle - Located in the center of downtown Great Barrington is a magnificent residence built in the 1800's by Mary Hopkins, widow of the renown railway tycoon Mark Hopkins. At a cost of \$16.5 million dollars the castle, is over 54,000 square feet, boasts over forty major rooms, and displays the luxuriant ambience enjoyed by the wealthy during America's Gilded Age.



Originally known as Kellogg Terrace, the castle was commissioned in 1875 for Mary Sherwood Hopkins by her husband Mark Hopkins, treasurer and one of the founders of the Central Pacific Railroad. Mark Hopkins died in 1878 and Mary Hopkins married Edward Francis Searles, who had designed the interior while the castle was being built. He was 23 years younger than she was. Hopkins died in 1891, but Searles maintained the castle until his death in 1920.

After Searles died, the structure was used as a private girls' school for 30 years. It then passed through a variety of owners and uses, serving as a training and conference center for The Home Insurance Company of New York, an all-girls boarding school, and a country club. From the mid-1980s, it housed John Dewey Academy, a school for troubled intellectually gifted teens. The castle was listed for sale in 2007 for \$15 million. It was sold to artist Hunt Slonem in 2021 for \$3.25 million.

The Searles Castle is a French chateau-style castle-style initially designed by Stanford White of McKim, Mead and White, a famous New York architectural firm at the time. The stone of the exterior of the castle is blue dolomite. All the pillars in the atrium were hollowed out except one. The Louis XV Versailles Room was imported from Venice. The wood floors are finger locked construction, meaning there are no nails used anywhere. The pond was built as a cross specifically so it could reflect the castle from the other side, to add to the beauty when people would have tea by the façade. The carriage house which currently stands was not the original. The original burned down a few years after the castle was completed, and was replaced by the current one.

Did you know? The 1996 movie *Before and After* was filmed in the castle. This movie included actors Liam Neeson and Meryl Streep. The 2016 movie *Like Lambs* was also filmed in the castle.

While the second historic walking tour allows visitors to explore the Du Bois Freedom Center. This tour explores the history of African American heritage in the Berkshires, the biography of W.E.B Du Bois, and the story of the town's first black church.

Studios at Mass MoCA - The Studios at MASS MoCA runs year-round, hosts up to 10 artists at a time for stays of 2 or 4 weeks, and primarily seeks applications from visual artists (painters, sculptors, installation artists, photographers, video/new media artists, fiber artists, printmakers, etc.) and writers in all literary disciplines. Artists from around the world are encouraged to apply.

Deadline: November 1st, 2025

The Iris Artistic Residency - is a collaboration between the Studios at MASS MoCA and The Berkshire Immigrant Center. This open call is for artists in Western or Central Massachusetts (Berkshire, Franklin, Hampshire, Hampden, Worcester) who are foreign-born, or identify as first or second generation American. We welcome applications from artists in all career stages, income levels, and disciplines (painters, sculptors, installation artists, fiber artists, printmakers, writers, performers, designers, photographers, filmmakers, etc.) whose practice allows them to work quietly (nothing is soundproofed, so power tools and loud music are discouraged).
