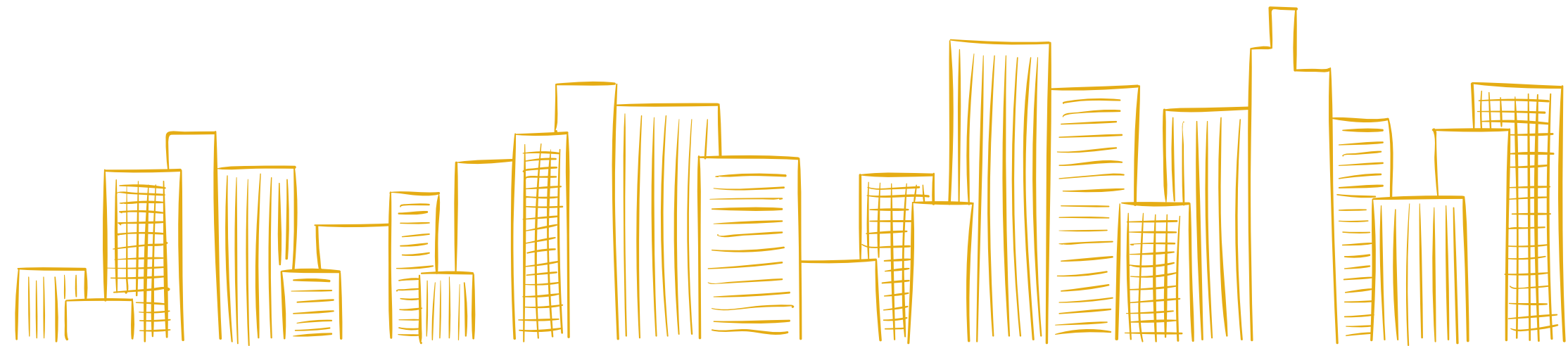

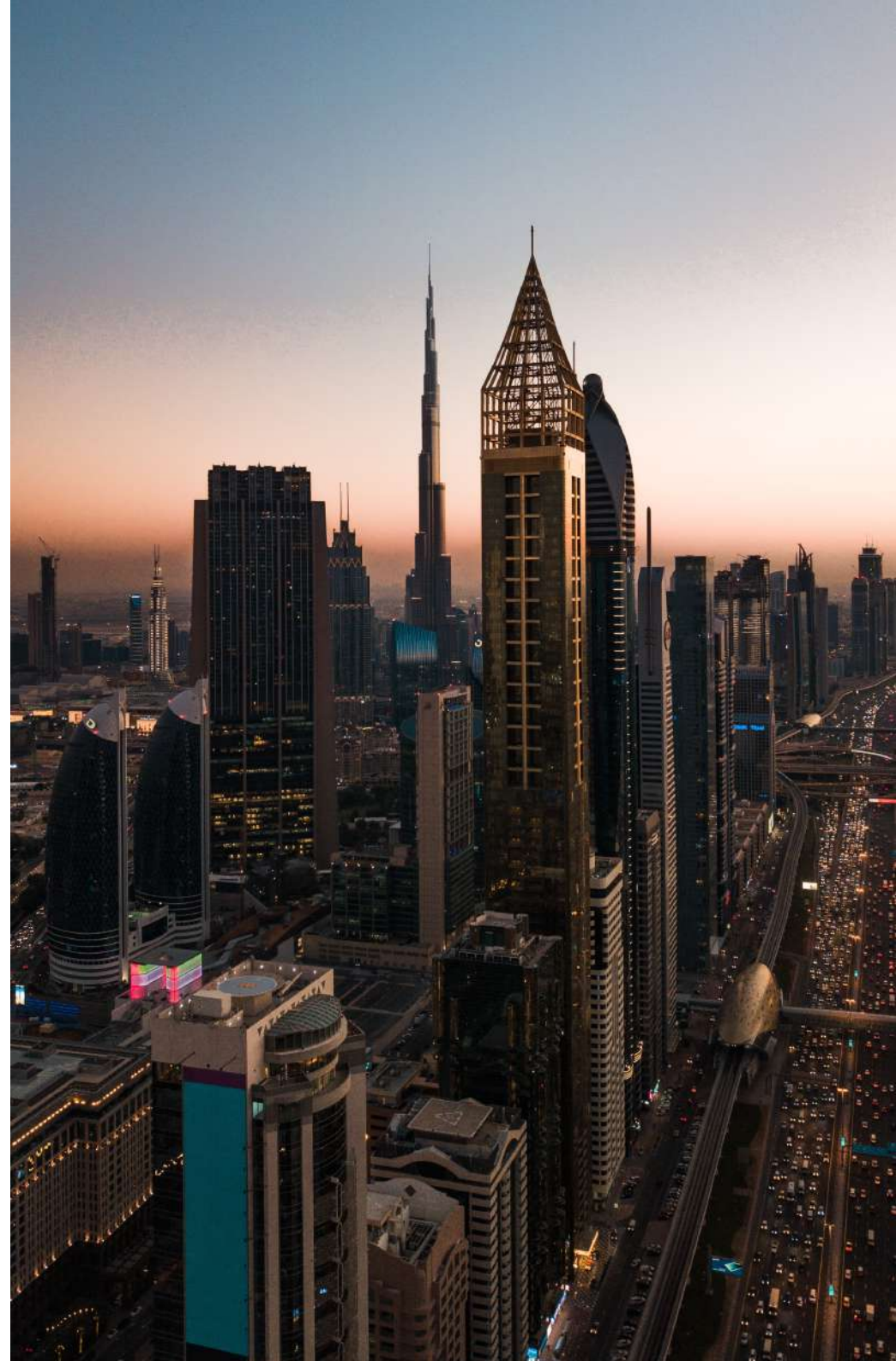
Our mission is to build prosperous cities

Decades of research on economic development has shown the primary determinant of prosperity is the quality of a country's laws and the integrity of its courts, administrators, and other legal institutions.



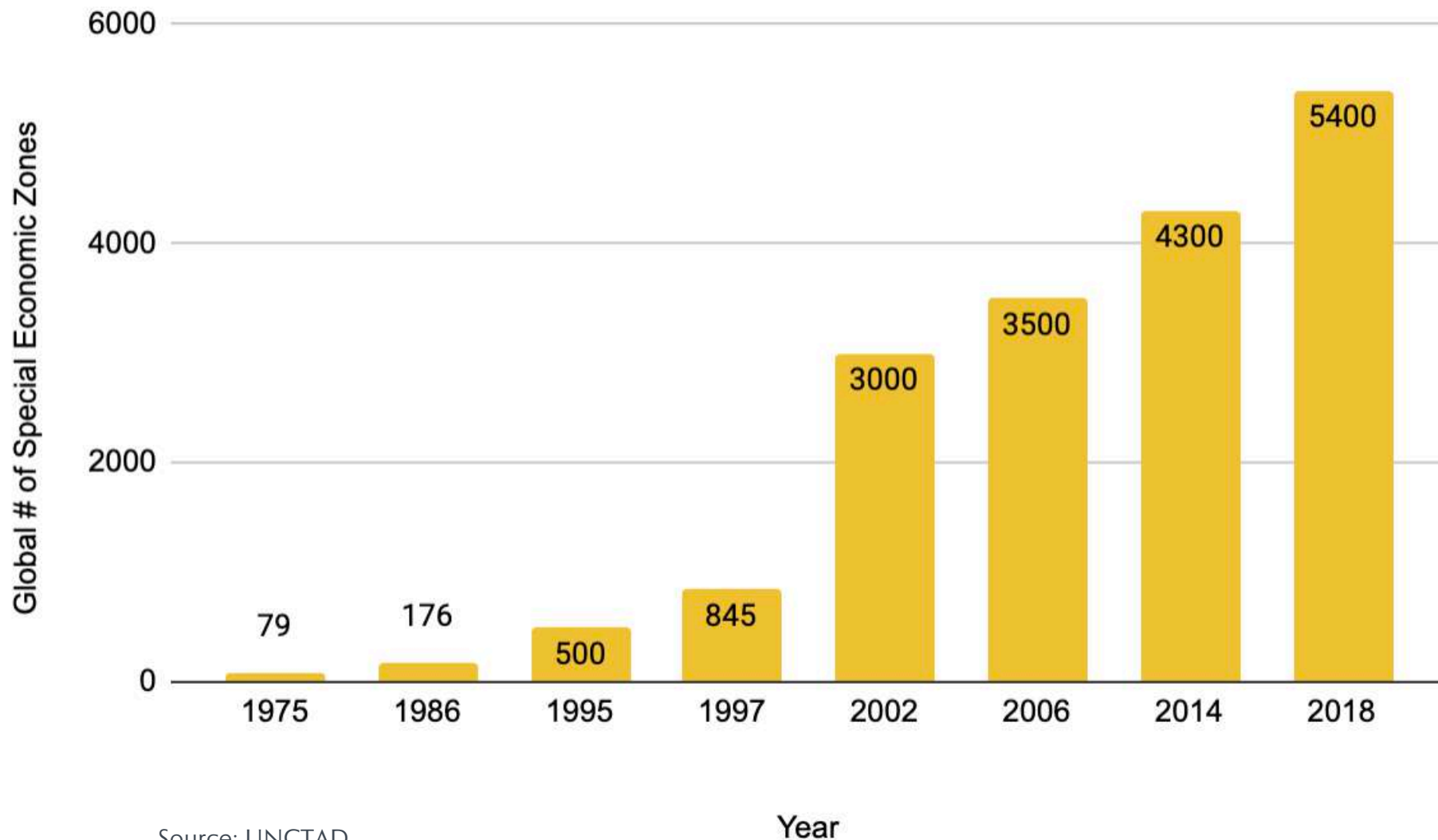


When institutions are outmoded, corrupted, or failing, the result is untold human suffering.
