Candidates must possess significant experience in the competitive marching arts, excellent communication skills, and the availability to attend winter and spring camps, as well as the DCI Summer Tour. This role requires a professional, positive, and high-energy commitment to fostering musical excellence within the Madison Scouts organization.

Duties:

- Implement performance and leadership education at off-season camps and during the summer tour
 - Including feedback to performers on all camp assignments.
 - Active participation in staff and membership slack channels.
 - Monitoring performer progress and individual growth throughout the winter and summer.
 - Creating a measurable growth plan for performers musical deficits.
- Collaborate with the brass educational team to ensure pedagogical approach and staff culture align with the expectations of the Madison Scouts program.
- Recruitment and retention of membership.
- Additional duties as assigned by the Brass Caption Head



Qualifications:

- Minimum 21 years of age
- Pass a criminal background check and reference check
- Availability to teach one-to-one virtual lessons throughout the offseason - flexible scheduling
- Availability to attend winter camps, as assigned by the Brass Caption Head
- Summer Availability - Commitment to consecutive two-weeks of spring training and/or tour
- Candidates with experience teaching world class DCI or WGI organizations are preferred

- Educational team members will be in a live-in position with the drum corps during the summer tour. Once competition begins the educational team will travel with the drum corps via sleeper bus to all performances and housing locations.
