1 CHECK YOUR VOTER REGISTRATION

Make sure you're registered and that your name and address are current.

Ask yourself:

- ☐ Am I registered?
- ☐ Is my address correct?
- ☐ Do I know my registration deadline?



For the November 3, 2026 Texas general election, VOTE411 currently lists October 5, 2026 as the voter-registration deadline.

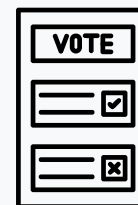

- ☐ Research candidates.
- ☐ Review propositions and local measures.
- ☐ Decide which issues matter most to you.

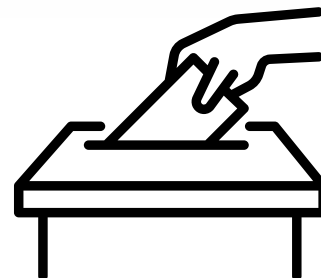

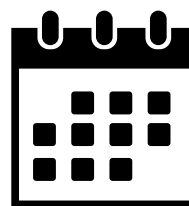
