Dear Parents, Caregivers and Friends of the School, Tēnā koutou katoa me ngā mihi nui ki a koutou katoa,

During the week, we celebrated Te Wiki o te Reo Māori. Te Wiki o te Reo Māori is an annual celebration for all New Zealanders to show their support for the Māori language, an official language of this country. It represents the resilience, adaptability and endurance of our language. Our Kapa Haka ropu led our assembly yesterday with two waiata and set the tone for a celebration of culture and learning. My thanks to Jed Hagger for his leadership this week and co-ordination of a successful 'Haka up' community event on Monday morning.

Thank you to those members of our community who filled out our community survey. Our board will be meeting early in term 4 to evaluate the key themes and provide feedback on the school's priorities moving forward as we look to develop the next three-year strategic plan for Belmont Intermediate School.

We have had some parents querying about our school donation. The Board of Trustees and staff of Belmont Intermediate are committed to providing the best possible learning environment and opportunities for every student. While we receive government funding, it falls short of the actual amount required to run the school and deliver our high standard of education. To help bridge this shortfall, we ask families to contribute a voluntary school donation. The donation is currently an annual charge of \$375 per student or \$250 per child for a family. The donations we receive contribute to vital areas such as:

- Teacher Aides
- Additional Counsellors
- Support staff across sports, the arts and technology
- IT & Al computer support and resources

In our recent parent survey, one of the strongest themes was the desire for more support in the classroom, through teacher aides, ESOL funding and specialist staff. Your donations directly support this initiative, enabling us to respond to what our community values most for our students.

Moving to the classroom, I thoroughly enjoyed being presented with several persuasive essays from students in room 18. Their topics and arguments ranged from installing a new pool, mountain bike track, having more choice within PE and a new putting and chipping green. The quality of writing was outstanding. Mason Arahovitis pitched an interesting scenario in his introduction when he said that I could reduce the number of double bogeys in my game if I built a boutique pitch-and-putt course at BIS. He is accurate with my golf game, however, I explained to him that this would not be happening and that the Waitemata Golf Club is just down the road.

As a community, we have enjoyed another action-packed, productive, and successful term, both inside and outside the classroom. Our students are thriving and taking all the opportunities that are afforded to them. Having been in several classrooms over the last two weeks, the quality of work, effort and progress is evident for all to see. In addition, and of equal importance, is the way in which our students communicate with each other and their teachers. The mutual respect is evident and contributes to a thriving



culture within our school. Finally, I would like to acknowledge and thank our teaching staff for their ongoing commitment to the school's intent and ethos.

I trust that you will all enjoy some quality time with your children, family and friends over the holidays. Stay safe and we look forward to finishing the year together next term. Term 4 commences on Monday, 6 October.

## **Out of Zone Enrolments Now Open**


The Belmont Intermediate School Board has determined that a limited number of out of zone places will be available for Year 7 in 2026. Applications for Out of Zone Enrolments for 2026 are now open and will close at 4pm on Friday, 10 October 2025.

To enrol your child as an out of zone applicant please complete the 2026 Online Enrolment Form on the website, stating your Priority Number. Out of zone places will be allocated in order of priority, please visit our website for the list of priorities.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot

conducted in accordance with the instructions by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. If required, the ballot will be held on Tuesday, 14 October 2025 and the results of the priority placement and ballot will be communicated to applicants by Friday, 17 October 2025.

Right now, students are in the midst of creating their prototype wind turbines. Important decisions are being made around size, shape, and materials, with lots of testing and adjustments along the way.

Stay tuned – we'll share more updates soon, including the announcement of the winning team's wind turbine!










## Glow in the Dark Disco a huge success!
