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Dear Parents, Caregivers and Friends of the School,

Making Waves in Marine Conservation

Our Year 8 learners have been making a real splash this term as they dive into the fascinating world of Marine Conservation. It's been a busy few weeks in the classroom, building knowledge and curiosity ahead of our upcoming trip to Goat Island Marine Reserve!

Students have explored the many layers of the ocean, mapped the flow of energy through marine food chains, and investigated why marine reserves play such an important role in protecting Aotearoa's coastal ecosystems.

In a creative twist, Room 15 turned their attention to the issue of marine pollution - with an artistic spin! Each student found a piece of litter around the school grounds and transformed it into a one-of-a-kind piece of Trash Art. The results (pictured below) are bright, bold, and thought-provoking - a colourful reminder that even small bits of rubbish can have a big impact on our marine environments.



Whale of a Learning Experience!

As part of their Integrated Studies on Marine Conservation, our Year 8 students were treated to an incredible visit from Project Jonah this week. The session brought ocean learning to life as students stepped inside a 17-metre inflatable Bryde's whale, gaining a unique, hands-on understanding of marine mammals, strandings, and the vital role these creatures play in our ocean ecosystems.

The experience was both fascinating and eye-opening, sparking plenty of discussion and curiosity ahead of next week's snorkelling trip to Goat Island Marine Reserve. It's been an unforgettable way to connect classroom learning with real-world marine conservation in action!

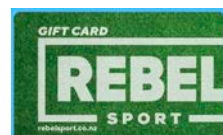
Celebrating Our Young Artists!

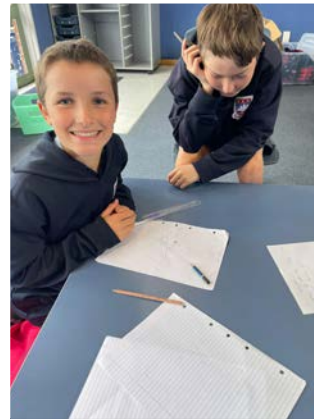


Mission to Space: Collaboration, Science, and Adventure!


