3. ESOL & Enhancement Bookings

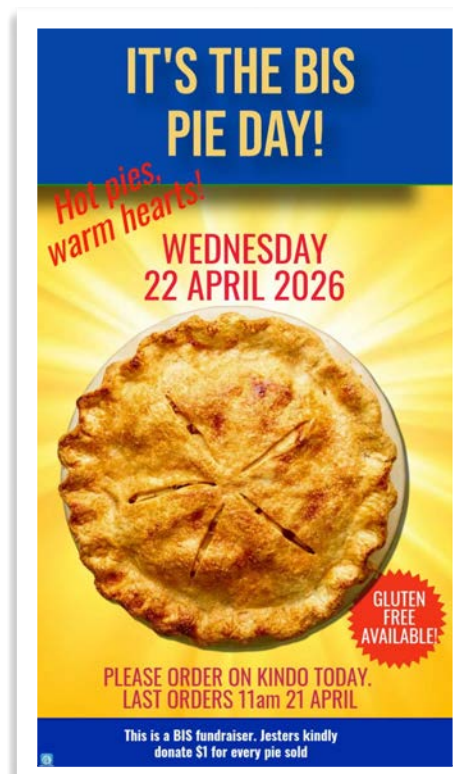

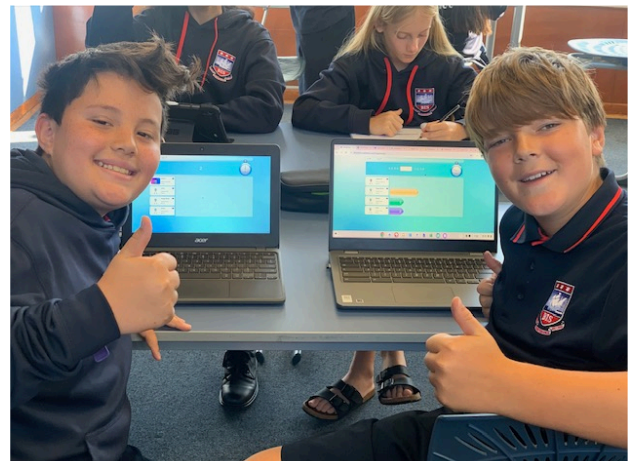
Focus on Maths 🧠+

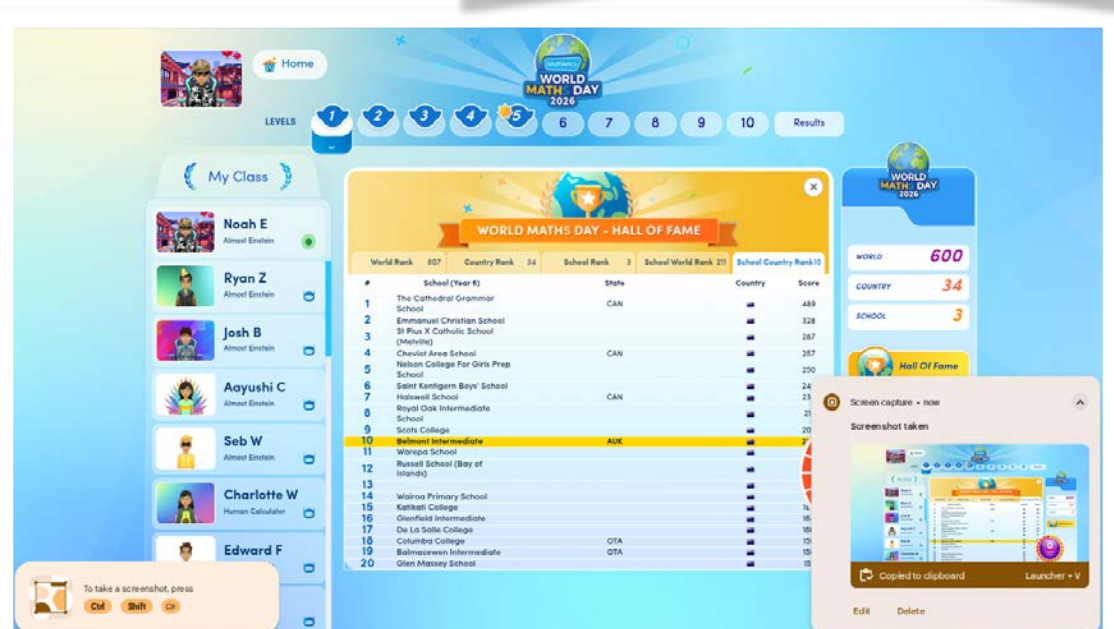

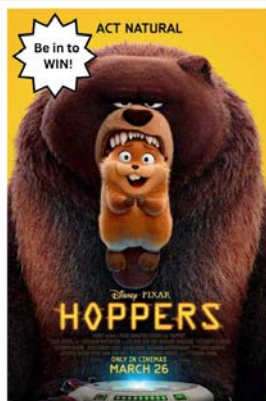
