Our location



Auckland is New Zealand's largest city. Belmont Intermediate School, established in 1957, is located on the Devonport Peninsula. Voted New Zealand's safest community, Devonport is just 10 minutes by ferry or a short drive over the harbour bridge to the city centre. An enviable lifestyle awaits you; safe, clean beaches, abundant recreational activities, cafes, bars, restaurants and shops, wide green open spaces and some of New Zealand's top performing schools. We have a partnership relationship with Takapuna Grammar School, our international students have the privilege of direct entry into the school.



The New Zealand Middle School Concept

New Zealand has a unique concept for educating the emerging adolescent. Students attend a separate two year intermediate school. Students are between 10-13 years of age. The education system is tailored to their needs; active, collaborative and creative. Intermediate schools act as a bridge between the primary and secondary systems. Students are in a homeroom environment, like the primary school system for the additional support this provides, but experience a rotating specialist programme with specialist teachers, preparing them for the challenges of secondary school. At Belmont Intermediate School students can choose electives from a wide range of topics for the afternoon block. In addition, our international students receive an individualised tailored ESOL programme.

Our international students



Looking after our international students and parents is important to us. Our International Student Director works hard to support the students and their families and is the first point of contact for enrolment.

Liaising between agents, parents, students, teachers and home-stay families, our International Student Director ensures that settling into a new school and community runs as smoothly as possible.

All our international students will be assisted by our International Student Director and a student buddy in their first week to adapt to the school environment. Students will be given support in:

- familiarisation with our school's layout and facilities
- explanation of school rules and procedures
- counselling services available and role of our International Student Director explained
- ESOL testing
- information on sports and extra-curriculum activities.

A native speaking counsellor is available and our buddy system helps students integrate and make new friends. A quality home-stay family can be arranged, but we encourage students of this age to live with a parent or a relative.

The International Student Director is always on hand throughout the year to personally assist our international students with any other concerns or queries that they may have.

At Belmont Intermediate School we have a dedicated ESOL teacher and a teacher aide to support our international students.

We have an ESOL programme which assists our international students with extra reading, writing, speaking and listening to help our students improve their English skills so that they can easily keep up with their Kiwi classmates. Our programmes utilise online individualised reading, grammar course books, spelling programmes, phonics and small group speaking practise lessons. In addition we offer English for Academic Purposes (EAP) for our advanced learners.

We are an NZQA Code Certified School.

Our electives, enhancement and enrichment programmes

Electives programme

As part of our school's commitment to offering an exciting and engaging curriculum, an electives programme is offered to all students. The goal of the electives programme is to inspire and encourage students to follow their passion and undertake learning of their choice across multiple disciplines. A vast array of electives is offered to allow our students the opportunity to experience new and challenging ways of learning.



Enhancement and enrichment learning programmes

We recognise that students do not all learn at the same pace, so we offer extension programmes in mathematics, science, sports, the arts and technology. Equally as important, we have a dedicated enhancement learning teacher and teacher aides available to assist students who require learning support.

For students who seek greater academic challenges, we offer specialist training and support to those wishing to compete in both national and international competitions such as Mathex, Auckland Intermediate Schools Art Exhibition, Kids Lit Quiz, Future Problem Solving, Otago Maths and International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS).

Education outside the classroom

Our outdoor education programme provides an opportunity for students to:

- Develop self-awareness and confidence in their own abilities
- Increase their personal fitness level
- Develop and practice a diverse range of skills
- Increase awareness of the environment
- Enjoy the social and personal benefits of interaction with others.

Our Year 7 outdoor education programme spans across 4-5 days and involves a number of activities which aims to challenge students physically, socially, emotionally and creatively. Year 8 students attend a highly anticipated week long camp at Waipu Cove. The students sleep in tents and participate in kayaking, caving, rafting, tubing, surf-lifesaving, survivor challenge, surfing, bush craft and bivouac building.



Visual and performing arts



Our visual and performing arts programmes offer students opportunities to develop and express their ideas and creativity, in a stimulating environment, under the guidance of our specialist teachers.

In visual arts, students are given an overview of the art elements. This gives them a sound base with which to express themselves in two-dimensional painting and drawing as well as three-dimensional sculpturing using a range of media.

We offer a comprehensive performing arts programme which encourages our students to experience music and dance in an active, creative and collaborative environment. Students participate in producing compositions and musical and dance performances. Some of the performance groups we offer include school productions, J-Rock, Dance Off, Battle of the Bands, BIS Idol, Belmont Intermediate School Kids in Theatre, jazz band, kapa haka, orchestra and rock bands.
