Dear Parents, Caregivers and Friends of the School,
Tēnā koutou katoa me ngā mihi nui ki a koutou katoa,

With rain on the horizon, the fixtures began early, with basketball and waterpolo kicking off a day of highly competitive action. Moving on to health and safety and protocols for attendance, sickness, and leaving school grounds.
Could I please remind our parent community about the following systems we have in place:

Lateness/Early Finishes:

If your child arrives at school later than 8:40am, students **MUST REPORT TO THE OFFICE AND SIGN IN** using the VisTab tablet. They will be issued with a late sticker, which they take to their class teacher to show they have signed in. In cases of repeated lateness, the Deputy Principals or the Principal will contact parents/caregivers. Students leaving early must also sign out at the office to obtain a leaving slip. Please copy the office in emails to inform them of early finishes, or students may not be permitted to leave the grounds without confirmation.

Absences:

All absences must be reported to the office, and the preferred notification method is via the Hero app. However, if you email the classroom teacher, please CC office@belmontint.school.nz. This ensures that if the classroom teacher is absent or not taking attendance for whatever reason, the office can code this correctly.

Sickness:

If your child becomes ill at school, they must report to the school administrator and the first aider, Ms Churches or Mrs Vorster, who will admit them to the sick bay and may contact parents/ caregivers to take them home. It is not acceptable for students to contact their parents via email, text or using a smartwatch to ask to be collected. Students must report to the office in the first instance.

Donations

Thank you to all the families who have already paid the donation and activity fee for 2026. This support makes a huge difference to the school's operation, allowing us to offer our students choices and opportunities in a well-maintained, well-resourced environment that exceeds the standard possible if the school relied solely on Ministry of Education funding. The donation has been set at \$375, and the activity fee for 2026 is \$165. However, we understand that it can be a significant amount to find at one time, so instalment options are available on our Online Shop. Donations to the school are eligible for a 33% tax credit, which can be claimed at the end of the tax year. If you pay through the online shop, donation receipts are available for download or printing at any time by logging into your account and selecting 'My Orders'.

Good luck to our finalists who will present their speeches at assembly on Monday. We look forward to hearing their carefully prepared speeches and seeing them share their ideas, confidence and passion with the school.

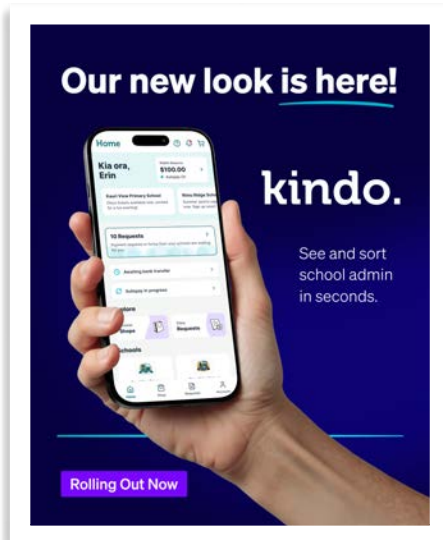

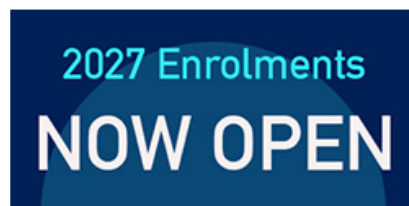

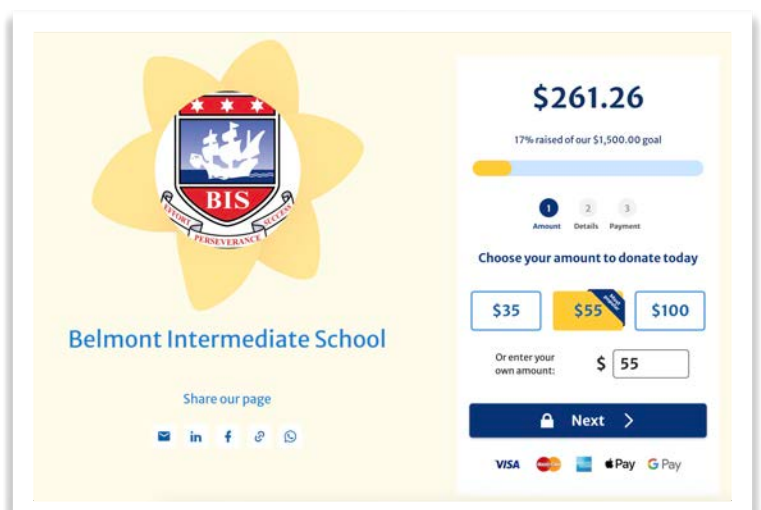
