



Every fall, the Alliance for Higher Education in Prison hosts the virtual **Incarcerated Scholars Conference (ISC)**. This event centers the voices of currently incarcerated scholars, graduates, and artists. Each conference has a central theme related to the experience of students pursuing postsecondary education while in correctional facilities.

Presentation Proposals

Each year, we invite currently incarcerated students and currently incarcerated alumni to share their scholarship through a live 30-min Zoom presentation + 30-min Q&A.

For presentations:

- Zoom access is required. At this time, we are unable to support other videoconferencing platforms.
- Self-submit or submit by proxy via Google Form or email only (mailed presentations not considered).
- Submissions must name a proxy (affiliated with an educational program) and a corrections contact.
- Notify facility staff ASAP to begin the process of obtaining required facility permission.

Creative Submissions

We also invite incarcerated artists to submit any form of creative work to the conference (no affiliation with educational programs is required).

We welcome a variety of art submissions, including:

- 2D drawings or paintings
- Audio or video recordings (ex. music)
- Performances
- Poetry

For creatives

- These submissions will not be presented by the artist live during the conference.
- Self-submit or submit by proxy via Google Form, email, or mail.
- Artists don't need to obtain facility permission or provide proxy/corrections contact information unless they want to be named.
- A signed media release is required.
