Book Example

Martinez, R. D., & Wong, S. H. (2020). *Learning in the digital age: Rethinking education for the 21st century*. Princeton University Press. <https://doi.org/10.1515/9781400841234>

This book examines the impact of digital technologies on learning environments. The authors argue that online tools, when integrated thoughtfully, improve collaboration and

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independent thinking. Martinez and Wong, both professors of education with extensive research backgrounds, combine large-scale surveys with case studies of schools in the United States and East Asia. The balanced perspective, paired with empirical data, makes the work reliable. For my research on technology in secondary education, this book offers both theoretical grounding and real-world examples, making it a central reference for the paper's discussion on innovation in classrooms.

Journal Article Example

Okafor, T. L. (2021). Student resilience and mental health support on campus. *Journal of College Counseling*, 24(2), 112–127. <https://doi.org/10.1002/jocc.12345>

Okafor explores how counseling services and peer support groups improve resilience among undergraduates. Using interviews and quantitative data from three universities, the study shows that students with regular access to mental health resources reported lower stress and higher academic performance. The article's strength lies in its mixed-methods design, which provides both depth and breadth. Okafor, a licensed counselor and researcher, writes with authority, and the journal's peer-review process adds credibility. This article will support my paper's section on wellness initiatives by offering evidence-based practices and by illustrating how mental health programs directly affect student outcomes.

Website Example

Nguyen, P. K. (2022, May 14). *The rise of renewable energy in urban communities*. Green Future Initiative. <https://www.greenfuture.org/urban-renewables>

This article describes how urban neighborhoods are adopting solar, wind, and small-scale hydro projects to reduce dependence on fossil fuels. Nguyen, an energy policy analyst, provides statistics from government reports and interviews with community leaders. While the article is not peer-reviewed, the references to official data make it a useful background source. For my project on sustainability policies, it helps demonstrate how local action supports national climate goals. The practical examples also offer context for understanding how smaller initiatives can scale to broader energy reforms.
