# Patient Assessment Methods used to collect information Nursing observations about behavior and mood Objective data from lab Subjective data Initial impressions based results or diagnostic tools on evidence gathered from patient reports Nursing Diagnoses / Problems Nursing problems identified through assessment Each problem linked to specific supporting evidence Rationale for selecting each diagnosis Prioritization of problems Nursing Care Plan Short-term and long-term goals of care

# Short-term and long-term goals of care Planned nursing interventions written clearly and separately Expected outcomes for each intervention Rationale behind every nursing action

Description of care delivery step by step

Adjustments made during the process

Documentation of interventions and patient responses

Collaboration with physicians or other healthcare professionals

Challenges encountered during implementation

# Evaluation

Comparison of patient outcomes with original goals

Details on what improved or remained unchanged

Analysis of the effectiveness of nursing interventions

Recommendations for future care or continued monitoring
