

PERSUASIVE ESSAY *Outline*

Introduction

Hook:

Start with a sentence that grabs attention. It can be a fact, a statistic, or a short statement that creates interest.

Background Information:

Provide brief context to help the reader understand the topic. Keep it short but relevant.

Thesis Statement:

State your main argument clearly. It should express your position and hint at the main points you'll cover.

Body Paragraph 1

First Supporting Point

Topic Sentence:

Introduce your first main argument in clear terms.

Evidence:

Present facts, data, or real-life examples that support this point.

Explanation:

Show how this evidence proves your argument. Connect it back to the thesis.

Mini Conclusion:

End the paragraph by reinforcing why this point matters.

Body Paragraph 2

Second Supporting Point

Topic Sentence:

Transition smoothly from the previous paragraph to the next major idea.

Evidence:

Use credible research or statistics that strengthen this claim.

Analysis:

Explain the reasoning behind your evidence. Why does it matter?

Link:

Connect this idea to the overall argument for continuity.

Body Paragraph 3

Third Supporting Point (Optional)

Topic Sentence:

Present an additional reason that supports your thesis.

Evidence:

Provide one or two examples that demonstrate this idea.

Explanation:

Clarify how these examples reinforce your overall argument.

Transition:

Prepare the reader for the upcoming counterargument section.

Counterargument Paragraph

Acknowledgment:

Briefly introduce the opposing viewpoint.

Refutation:

Use logic, facts, or examples to show why that view is less convincing.

Reinforcement:

Restate the strength of your original position.

Conclusion

Restate the Thesis:

Say your main argument again, but in fresh words.

Summarize Key Points:

Remind readers of the strongest ideas from your essay.

Broader Meaning:

Show why this argument matters beyond the essay itself.

Final Line:

End with a thought, call to action, or closing insight that lingers.
