

Statement of Purpose

Business decisions rarely happen in controlled environments. Leaders make choices with incomplete information, shifting markets, and competing priorities. My professional experience in supply chain operations has shown me how strategic decisions affect both organizational performance and everyday workflows. I have seen how small adjustments in logistics, vendor relationships, and forecasting models can significantly influence cost efficiency and customer reliability. These experiences shaped my interest in business strategy and operational leadership. I am applying to the MBA program to deepen my understanding of strategic management, data-driven decision making, and organizational leadership.

I earned my bachelor's degree in Economics from Northfield University, where I developed a strong interest in market systems and organizational behavior. Courses in managerial economics and quantitative analysis introduced me to the analytical tools used to evaluate business performance. My senior research project examined pricing strategies in regional retail markets, focusing on how firms respond to local competition and consumer demand patterns.
