I. Introduction

V. Conclusion

- **Restated thesis:** the main argument rewritten with fresh wording.
- **Synthesis of key points:** a concise explanation of how the claims, evidence, and rebuttal fit together.
- **Final insight or broader thought:** a prediction, reflective question, recommended solution, or connection to a larger issue.
