A regular meeting of the City Council was held at City Hall, 110 S Ash, on Tuesday, April 21, 2026, at 6:30 p.m., with Mayor Kerry Symons presiding. Mayor Symons gave the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Mayor Symons welcomed guests.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Miguel Valenzuela thanked the City for helping organize the Community Clean-up Day on April 18, 2026.

CONSIDER APPROVING MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETINGS: COUNCILMAN J ASTON MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF MARCH 17, 2026, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BRAD KILE. ALL VOTED AYE, MOTION CARRIED. COUNCILMAN J ASTON MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF MARCH 24, 2026, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BRAD HERRING. ALL VOTED AYE, MOTION CARRIED.

CONSIDER PAYING BILLS OF THE PREVIOUS MONTH: Blasingame informed Council that that the second set of payables were sent on Friday, April 17, 2026. The next set will be sent on Friday, May 8, 2026. There were no construction estimates at this time.

CONSIDER ADOPTING ORDINANCE #038-26, AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026 BUDGET: Blasingame asked council to consider adopting Ordinance #038-26, the second amendment to the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Budget. ORDINANCE 038-26

AMENDMENT NO. 2 to the 2025-2026 BUDGET

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2025, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2026, FOR THE CITY OF PERRYTON, OCHILTREE COUNTY, TEXAS.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Perryton, Texas, on the 26th day of August, 2025 adopted the Fiscal Budget of the City for the period beginning October 1, 2025, all such proceedings being in accordance with Vernon’s Texas Local Government Code, Sections 102.001 through 102.011 and

WHEREAS, Section 102.009 provides that amendments may be made to the adopted budget in cases of public necessity to meet unusual and unforeseen conditions which could not, by reasonable, diligent thought, have been included in the original budget, the City Council hereby finds it necessary to further amend the original budget for both anticipated revenues and expenditures.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PERRYTON, TEXAS:

DISCUSS AND CONSIDER THE FIRE PROTECTION SERVICE CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF PERRYTON AND OCHILTREE COUNTY:

Waters explained to council that the Fire Protection Service Contract between the City of Perryton and Ochiltree County was entered into effect on June 5, 1990 and has had no amendments or changes to date. Waters asked the council to consider holding a joint meeting between the City of Perryton and Ochiltree County Commissioners to discuss and decide how best to continue to serve the citizens of Ochiltree County with fire protection services. **COUNCILMAN BRAD HERRING MADE A MOTION TO HOLD A JOINT MEETING BETWEEN THE CITY OF PERRYTON AND OCHILTREE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TO DISCUSS AND DECIDE HOW TO BEST CONTINUE TO SERVE THE CITIZENS OF OCHILTEE COUNTY, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN GREG GOOD. ALL VOTED AYE, MOTION CARRIED.**

EXECUTIVE SESSION – REAL PROPERTY (AUTH. TX GOV. CODE SEC. 551.072): Mayor Symons began the Executive at 7:05 p.m. The Executive Session was closed at 7:26 p.m. No action taken.

CONSIDER THE PURCHASE OF A 15-ACRE TRACT LOCATED IN SECTION 22, BLOCK 11, AHRENBECK SURVEY: Waters informed council that the 15-acre tract of land located south of the City Swimming Pool was available for sale to the City of Perryton for \$16,000.00. Waters recommendation for the land would be minimal development as a wildland/nature park, utilizing funds obtained through the Texas Parks and Wildlife program trails grant program. **COUNCILMAN J ASTON MADE A MOTION TO AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT TO PURCHASE A 15-ACRE TRACT LOCATED IN SECTION 22, BLOCK 11 AHRENBECK FOR \$16,000.00, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BRAD HERRING. ALL VOTED AYE, MOTION CARRIED.**

CONSIDER ACCEPTING A FUEL BID FOR THE PROVISION OF BULK FUEL FOR THE CITY OF PERRYTON: Waters informed council that one fuel bid was received from Perryton Equity. The bid was opened on April 21, 2026 at 3:00 p.m. Waters explained to council that the City of Perryton's current fuel bid expired on March 31, 2026. **COUNCILMAN BRAD KILE MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE BID FROM PERRYTON EQUITY FOR THE PROVISION OF FUELS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BID SPECIFICATIONS AND CONDITIONS SPECIFIED, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BRADY BURDICK. ALL VOTED AYE, MOTION CARRIED.**

REVIEW FINANCIAL REPORTS FOR THE PREVIOUS MONTH: Blasingame presented the financial reports for the month ending March 31, 2026.
