



Job Description: Marine Debris Data Technician

You will be hired as independent contractors by Sustainable Coastlines Hawai'i. You can commit from 1 to 7 full days between **Thursday, September 17 to Friday, September 25 at Kapaa Quarry (Kailua, O'ahu)**. Pay is \$22/hour for 8-hour shifts from 7am to 4pm with a 1-hour unpaid lunch break.

You must arrive on time and ready to work if you are scheduled. Work includes setting up stations for sorting, moving silo bags with help of a forklift driver, learning how to identify various types of marine debris, counting and weighing of sorted trash, sourcing plastic debris to their origin and production date, staying organized, and being able to work together as a team with respectful communication.

Our mission with this catch analysis is to collect data on marine debris collected by Papahānaumokuākea Marine Debris Project (PMDP) and Sustainable Coastlines Hawai'i (SCH).

This is a hands-on and rewarding job. We estimate we will be sorting and collecting data on over 40,000 lbs of marine debris! While cleaning up beaches and our oceans is incredible work, the data we collect will give us insight into where this debris is coming from, the type of debris and how we can stop this marine debris from ending up in our oceans in the first place.

This is a 7-day temporary contracted job but our team will have more contracted jobs as we approach our winter surf season with Sustainable Events.

Responsibilities Include:

- Setting up sorting systems daily at warehouse.
- Identifying, sorting, and organizing marine debris.
- Look for clues of origin and production date.
- Properly weighing and collecting data.
- Working with the team to move silo bags.
- Cleaning the warehouse after sorting to ensure marine debris does not pollute the area.

Necessary Requirements:

- Transportation and **ability to be on time.**
- Ability to work in a team-oriented, fast-paced environment.
- Excellent communication with other staff and managers.
- Ability to lift 50 lbs.
- Comfortable working with trash.
- Ability to work long hours standing and moving in a warehouse without AC (fans and shade will be provided)
- Knowledge of, willingness to learn, and enthusiasm for sustainability.
