VETERANS GOLF

On Monday last week, 20 of our members played our first away game of the year at Moore Park, on a sunny Autumn day. The game was an Individual Stableford over 2 grades, and a 2 Ball Best Ball teams event. The players I spoke to were highly impressed by the course, and, assisted by slightly increased handicaps, produced some quite good scores. The consensus was that it was a course worth revisiting. Our Vice-Captain, Bruce Miller, organised the day, so it was fitting that he won the Individual Stableford in A-Grade with 39pts, off his 25 handicap, with Matt Hawkins (H25) runner-up with 38pts. Harry Waters (H37) was the worthy winner of B-Grade, with 37pts, just nudging out Roy Mercer (H33), who finished runner-up with 36pts. Harry partnered John Mongan to win the 2 Ball Best Ball team event with 45pts, just shading the team of Roy and Graeme Oake, who finished runners-up with 44pts.

Longest Drives on the 8th went to Vito Caronna (A-Grade) and Tony Marando (B-Grade), and on the 18th to Geoff Greenwell (A-Grade) and Robert Chung-Gon (B-Grade). Vito also won the Nearest The Pin for A-Grade on both 2nd and 15th, and while there was no claimant for the NTP in B-Grade on 2nd, Joe Oliver claimed it for B-Grade on 15th.

Last Friday, 33 of our valued members played in an Individual Stableford, which included 4 playing in the semi-finals of the COW. The day started fine and sunny, but became cloudy as the day progressed, and thankfully most of the field had completed their rounds by the time rain commenced. Whilst Royal North got none of the rain that fell heavily in nearby suburbs early in the week, there were still wet spots on some holes, and the rough was long in places. 10 of the 33 starters had more than 36 Stableford points, but the only scores in the 40s were recorded by A-Graders. In A-Grade, George Faith (H24) had the highest score with 42pts (20 + 22), closely followed by John Mongan on 41. Don Morris and Matt Hawkins both scored 40pts, with Don finishing 3rd, on count-back. In B-Grade Tony Marando was the only one to break par, with 37pts, making it his 2nd win in his last 3 games. (It was interesting to note that 3rd place in B-Grade was determined on count-back, after 5 players finished tied on 35pts.) In C-Grade, Joe Oliver came back

to form with 39pts, while David Courtenay's 3rd place was his first placing with the Vets. There were 16 birdies recorded, 11 on the very short 17th (playing only around 140 metres). Don Morris had 4 birdies and 9 pars in his round. He only has to par the 11th hole to have parred every hole this year, and his handicap is now down to 4. Don also recorded a Longest Drive and a Nearest The Pin, leaving him with only 1 Longest Drive left. Peter Ferrett had 2 Longest Drives today. And it was good to see Gary Peters back again, after a 5 week break.

In the COW semi-finals, Mal Cross defeated Andy Hayes on count-back (c/b), and Graeme Oake defeated Joe Scardino, 3 up. Mal was 1 up after 16 holes, and Andy took the 17th to tie the match, but was unable to sink a relatively short putt that would have won him the match. Both players had reasonable rounds – Mal with 36pts and Andy with 35pts. In the other semi-final, Graeme led for most of the match, being 3 up after 15 holes. Again, both Graeme and Joe had solid rounds – Graeme with 39pts and Joe with 36pts.

A-Grade: 1st George Faith (H24) 42pts; 2nd John Mongan (H17) 41pts; 3rd Don Morris (H6) 40pts, on c/b.

B-Grade: 1st Tony Marando (H28) 37pts; 2nd Bob Collyer (H26) 36pts; 3rd Les Bassett (H26) 35pts, on c/b.

C-Grade: 1st Joe Oliver (H34) 39pts; 2nd Rob Beaton (H35) 37pts; 3rd David Courtenay (H40) 33pts, on c/b.

Longest Drives: Don Morris, Geoff Greenwell, Les Bassett, Tony Marando and Peter Ferrett (2).

Nearest the Pins: Mal Cross, Don Morris, Gary Peters, Ian Miller, David Courtenay and Rob Beaton.
