Invitation to Join a Regional Circle on Regenerative Tourism

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

We are inviting you to become a member of a Regional Circle — a community of changemakers committed to transforming tourism toward regeneration. We intend for these Circles to become a cornerstone of a global network to emerge from the **Regenerative Tourism 2026 (un)Summit on Camiguin Island, Philippines, from 5 to 7 November 2026**.

We want to invite you to join us as we believe your vision, experience, perspective, and commitment can offer an invaluable contribution.

Who We Are

Transforming tourism is an initiative **7Generations** started with the conviction that tourism can — and must — become Life giving and growing instead of extractive. Rooted in regenerative principles and the wisdom of guardianship across generations, we dream of building a global network of practitioners, leaders, and institutions who share our dream for regenerative tourism and who have the courage to act now.

Our network spans hospitality operations, destination management, education and training, community development, governmental and non-governmental organisations, and academic research. What unites us is purpose, not sector or geography.

What Are Regional Circles ?

Regional Circles are regionally anchored communities. They are the starting points for the creation of a global network and collectively support the preparation for the (un)Summit.

We invite each Regional Circle to have 4 meetings before the beginning of October 2026.

Ideally the members of each circle will meet once a month in the run-up to the (un)Summit to:

- Identify the key questions, opportunities and challenges that regenerative tourism faces in their region
- Reflect on the regenerative trajectory of the projects represented in the Circle
- Surface systemic barriers — and explore whether these are local, regional, or universal
- Create a common picture of their story and vision as a regenerative tourism destination
- Develop a concrete contribution to present at the (un)Summit in Camiguin Island in November 2026

Like the acupuncturist who does not rebuild the body but restores the conditions for it to heal, the Regional Circles do not aim to prescribe solutions: They intend to identify needle points — those small interventions capable of catalysing a regenerative transformation within and across destinations.

What We Offer

Members of the Regional Circles benefit from a comprehensive support ecosystem. This includes:

- **A clear shared vision:** grounded in regenerative principles and Ancient Earth Wisdom — building tourism systems for the next seven generations.
- **The Circle Business Model:** an introduction to a participatory, non-hierarchical approach to organisational management with protocols that ensure all voices matter.
- **A journey, not a destination:** an evolving path toward regeneration, supported by structured inputs and peer exchange.
- **Participation in the Regenerative Tourism (un)Summit:** joining to present, learn, and forge lasting partnerships.

Above all, membership offers the opportunity to grow as a **Guardian of Regenerative Tourism** beyond the (un)Summit, and to take responsibility for the communities and living systems in which we all operate and of which we are all an integral part.

What We Ask of You

Regional Circles thrive on exchange and co-creation. We ask members to:

- Bring genuine commitment to regenerative tourism and transformation — curiosity and dedication matter more than perfection.
- Attend regular (monthly) regional meetings until the (un)Summit — consistent presence is the foundation of trust and collective momentum.
- Participate in the global (un)Summit — bringing your voice, questions, experience, challenges and sharing examples and experiments — concrete cases that the broader network can learn from.
- Work toward a consolidated group output to be presented at the (un)Summit.

We invite you to identify your first need — to be part of a growing global network that believes tourism can become a force for life.
