Letter from the Director

Ten years ago, a small group of neighbors and advocates came together to address a glaring truth: the people of Miami-Dade County deserve, and need, better transit. Out of that spark, Transit Alliance Miami was born.

Our work really kicked off in 2017 when we brought together advocates to successfully restore \$15 million in transit funding. Since then, our small but mighty organization has grown into a nationally-recognized movement known for bold advocacy and deep community engagement, centered on the yet-to-beachieved vision of a Miami built for people, not cars.

As we reflect on the past decade, I'm beyond heartened by what we've accomplished. Our team, supporters, and the dedicated volunteers who are the lifeblood of our work, have worked tirelessly to shape a Miami that's easier, and fairer, to move around. We've helped restore millions in transit funding, redesigned the bus system for the first time in 40 years, and pushed for safer solutions.

Good transit begins at our doorstep, with sidewalks, protected bike lanes, and shaded shelters being a taste of cost-effective investments that feed into greater transit access. To improve the transit stories across neighborhoods, we must set an agenda for transit that delivers practical, time-sensitive solutions for and by the people who move around Miami. Transit Alliance Miami will build on public support, and even more than improving what we have, we will reimagine transit systems to make people want to live, work, invest, and above all, stay in this Magic city.

The road ahead — or should I say, bike path ahead — has both challenges and promise. But with our committed community of transit advocates, policy makers, students, volunteers, and organizations who share our vision, I know we can harness the opportunity to make Miami move safer, faster, and happier.



Campaign Highlights

Better Bus Network

Miami-Dade's first comprehensive bus system redesign in 40 years, led by community advocacy.


- Conducted 130+ public workshops and events with 28,000+ resident touchpoints.
- → Built a coalition of 26 organizations and mobilized over 200 volunteers.
- Secured unanimous County Commission approval in 2021, and 2023.
- → Implemented in late 2023, resulting in a 20% increase in bus ridership within six months.



Mobility Scorecard

A recurring performance accountability tool grading Miami-Dade's transit, biking, and walking infrastructure.

- Published in 2018 and 2023, each iteration based on system data and community feedback.
- → Identified key issues including Metrorail gaps of more than 30 minutes, costly trolley inefficiencies, and lack of State Transportation Statistics reporting.
- → Highlighted that 95% of bike lanes remain unprotected.
- → Informed direct outreach to elected officials and public agencies.



Paved Paradise

A public education campaign exposing how outdated parking mandates undermine vibrant, affordable communities.

- Created accessible, narrative-driven explainer series on parking history, policy, and reform.
- Engaged planners, housing advocates, and elected officials in rethinking land use priorities.
- Strengthened advocacy for reduced parking minimums in transit-oriented corridors.



Build It, Bike It!

A programming and advocacy push to create a safe, connected, and protected bike lane network countywide.

- → Surveyed and mapped gaps in infrastructure, showing only ~3% of bike lanes are protected.
- → Led community bike rides and pop-ups to gather input and mobilize support.
- → Elevated cyclist safety in local transportation planning processes.



It Takes Transit

A community pledge campaign rallying public advocacy for a safer, more equitable, and affordable future of transit.

- Framed around four pillars: equity, affordability, health, and connectivity.
- Secured hundreds of pledges from riders, students, and residents.
- → Leveraged as a platform for civic engagement and direct advocacy with public officials.

What's Ahead

Earlier in 2025, with support from the Knight Foundation, the Transit Alliance Miami team crafted a five-year strategic plan aimed at meeting and building on this moment. While government funding faces constraints, we see unprecedented opportunity: private sector partners ready to engage and, most uniquely, a decade of community-building has transformed public support for transit in Miami from a long-shot to the beginnings of a movement. Over the next five years, Transit Alliance Miami will invest in community building and harness these partnerships to deliver the multimodal future Miami demands and deserves. Our campaign priorities include:

People Power

Building new TAM chapters in neighborhoods Countywide.

Real change happens at the neighborhood level. We're launching TAM chapters across all 13 County Commission Districts, building from successful campaigns that engaged 28,000+ residents. In 2026, we'll develop at least six chapters primed to advocate for signature implementation projects in their neighborhoods. Each chapter will champion local projects while contributing to countywide advocacy, creating a grassroots movement that makes transit decisions truly democratic.

Safe Streets for Everyone

More, safer sidewalks and bike paths.

We're championing protected bike lanes and complete sidewalks in every neighborhood. With only 3% of bike lanes currently protected and countless missing sidewalk connections, we'll push for quick-build pedestrian projects and enforceable Vision Zero commitments. This moment demands we transform dangerous streets into safe passages that connect you from your doorstep to transit, work, and community.

Neighborhoods that Work

Transit-oriented communities that fill residents' real-life needs.

Great transit needs vibrant communities around it. We're advocating for housing people can afford near transit stops, schools and parks within walking distance, and local businesses that thrive when cars aren't required. By reducing parking mandates and prioritizing people–friendly development, we're ensuring transit investments create neighborhoods that meet residents' real needs.

Good Government

Stronger accountability from government and elected officials.

Trust in transit requires transparency. We'll push for greater oversight over municipal transportation spending, public participation standards, and accountability mechanisms that put community voices at the center of decision–making. By demystifying transit decisions, we're building a government that delivers on its promises and earns public confidence.

Continued Advocacy

Protecting and Expanding equitable, reliable transit for all Miamians.

Protecting existing transit while expanding connecting infrastructure requires constant vigilance. From stopping fare increases to preventing service cuts during budget crises, we'll mobilize our growing coalition to defend what we've built. Our proven track record, \$15M saved and 20% ridership increase, shows that sustained advocacy delivers results for all Miamians.
