

# Rejoice in the Lord: Devotional

*The Book of Philippians is one of the New Testament letters written by the Apostle Paul during his imprisonment, likely around AD 62. Addressed to the Christian community in Philippi, a city in ancient Macedonia, this epistle is often celebrated for its themes of joy, unity, and perseverance in the face of adversity.*

## Week One: Saved and Set Apart to Serve

*Sermon Date: Sunday, July 13, 2025*

### Day 1: Servants of Christ

**Scripture:** *Philippians 1:1 — “Paul and Timothy, servants of Christ Jesus...”*

#### **Theme: Your Purpose Is to Serve**

Paul could have introduced himself as an apostle, but instead he chooses the word *doulos*—slave. His identity was rooted not in status or title, but in *submission* to Christ.

#### **Reflection:**

We live in a world that prizes personal freedom, but the Christian life begins with surrender. Joy begins when we stop striving for control and start delighting in our role as willing servants of a Great God. Like Paul, your life is not your own—you were bought with a price. Your highest purpose is to serve Christ in love.

#### **Prayer:**

Lord, thank You for saving me and calling me to serve You. Help me embrace my role as Your servant with joy. Teach me to trust in Your authority and delight in obedience. Amen.

## Day 2: Saints in Christ

**Scripture:** *Philippians 1:1* — “...to all the saints in Christ Jesus who are at Philippi...”

### **Theme: Your Position Is Secure**

You are a *hagios*, a saint—not because you’ve earned it, but because God has *set you apart*. To be in Christ is to be secure, hidden in Him, just as Noah was secure in the ark.

### **Reflection:**

Insecurity often robs us of joy. But your identity is not in what others say, or even in what you feel—your identity is in Christ. You are holy, chosen, and secure. When God sees you, He sees you in His Son.

### **Prayer:**

Father, thank You that I am not defined by my past but by my position in Christ. Teach me to live like someone set apart for Your glory. May I grow into the holiness You've declared over me. Amen.

## Day 3: Unity Leads to Joy

**Scripture:** *Philippians 1:1* — “...including the overseers and deacons...”

### **Theme: Your Community Matters**

Paul includes leaders and members together—no hierarchy, just mutual service. Joy thrives in unity. Disunity, on the other hand, breeds discouragement and bitterness.

### **Reflection:**

Joy isn't meant to be lived out in isolation. As a saint and servant, you're part of a spiritual family. Are there relationships in your church or home that need healing? Seek unity, not division. Serve with humility, not pride.

### **Prayer:**

Jesus, You prayed that we would be one as You and the Father are one. Help me pursue unity in my church and relationships. Make me a peacemaker and a joyful servant in community. Amen.

## Day 4: The Difference Between Joy and Happiness

**Scripture:** *Philippians 1:18* — “...*Christ is proclaimed, and in that I rejoice. Yes, and I will rejoice...*”

### **Theme: Joy Is Rooted in Christ, Not Circumstances**

Paul writes this letter from prison, yet it overflows with joy. Why? Because his joy wasn't tied to comfort but to *Christ being glorified*.

### **Reflection:**

Happiness is based on what happens. Joy is based on Who never changes. Even when life feels chaotic, you can rest in God's unchanging sovereignty. Rejoice—not because life is easy, but because God is good, and His promises stand.

### **Prayer:**

Lord, give me joy that goes deeper than my circumstances. Remind me that Your presence and Your purpose are constant, even when life isn't. Teach me to rejoice always, for You are always worthy. Amen.

## Day 5: Grace and Peace—Your Daily Privileges

**Scripture:** *Philippians 1:2* — “Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.”

### Theme: Your Privilege Is Grace and Peace

God speaks a divine greeting over your life: *Grace* (the undeserved favor of God) and *Peace* (the settled state of reconciliation with God). These aren’t just words—they’re realities you live in every day.

### Reflection:

What voices are you listening to each day? Let the first voice you hear be God’s: “Grace and peace to you.” You are not striving to earn His favor; you live in it. You are not at war with God; you are at peace with Him through Jesus.

### Prayer:

Father, thank You for speaking grace and peace over my life. Help me walk in that confidence every day. When anxiety creeps in, let Your peace rule my heart. When I feel unworthy, remind me of Your grace. Amen.

### Final Thought:

You are a **servant of Christ**, a **saint in Christ**, and a **recipient of grace and peace from Christ**. No matter what life looks like today, you can *rejoice in the Lord always*—because joy is not a feeling. It’s a Person.
