Find some sticks outside and have fun making the numbers 1 to 10. How about 2 plus 3? Or 6 plus 4? What other numbers can you make?



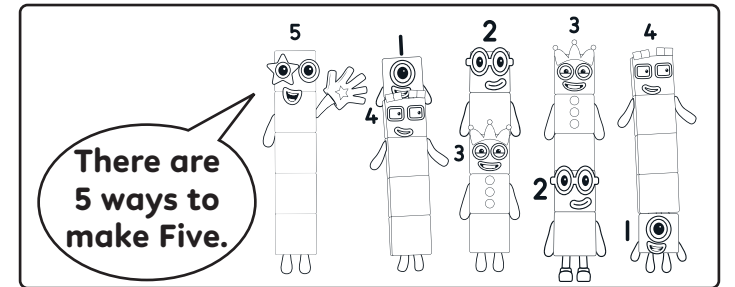
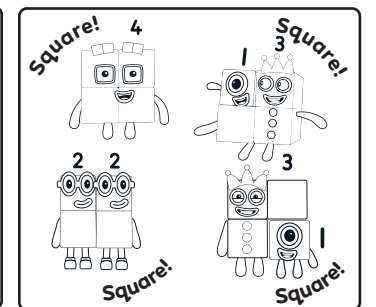
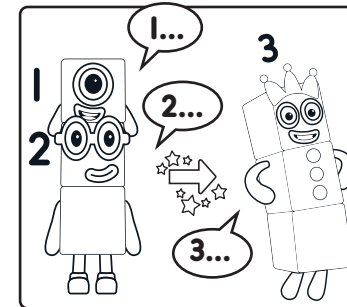
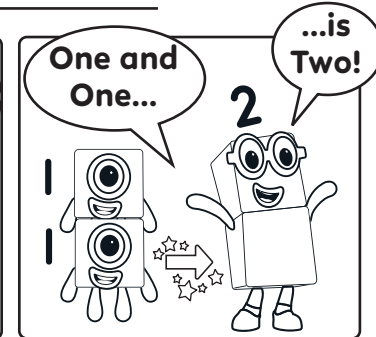
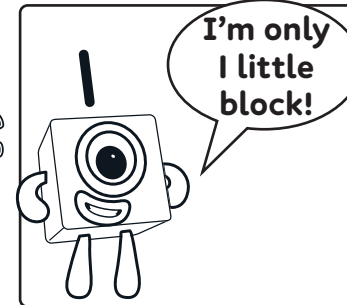
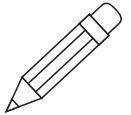
Play Together
