**Selection Procedure (members)**

The group will ensure balanced representation between various stakeholder groups, and include the

following members:- individuals appointed in a personal capacity who shall act independently and in the public interest ('Type A' Members). This may include academics and researchers working on forced labour policy and supply chain monitoring;- individuals appointed to represent a common interest shared by stakeholders in the field of forced labour policy, who do not represent an individual stakeholder, but a policy orientation common to different stakeholder organisations ('Type B' Members);- civil society, social partners (representative organisations of workers and employers), business, and research organisations ('Type C' members). These may include EU-wide or global organisations representing industry, trade, workers' rights, human rights, and research institutes working on forced labour policy and supply chain monitoring;- public entities other than Member States' authorities, including international organisations, carrying out activities related to the issue of forced labour, including research, and/or contributing to the fight against forced labour ('Type E' Members). Organisations ('Type C' Members) and public entities ('Type E' Members) shall nominate their representatives and shall be responsible for ensuring that their representatives provide a high level of expertise. DG GROW may refuse the nomination by an organisation of a representative if it considers such nomination inappropriate in the light of the requirements specified in the call for applications. In such case, the organisation concerned shall be asked to appoint another representative. Members who are no longer capable of contributing effectively to the expert group's deliberations, who, in the opinion of DG GROW, do not comply with the conditions set out in Article 339 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union or who resign, shall no longer be invited to participate in any meetings of the group and may be replaced for the remainder of their term of office.
