THE CHERISH Life Network

The Diocese has an established Cherish Life Network for people interested in the defence of human life. The network recognises concerns about essential, life-sustaining care and treatment at all stages of life and aims to steer people who have those concerns towards the guidance and support they need.

We are engaged: working together to counter ongoing moves to legalise assisted suicide.

We give witness: opposing the ongoing campaign to legalise abortion without restriction, up to birth. We campaign against this for babies and their mothers, mindful that such moves could potentially deny women the opportunity to explore alternatives and leave them vulnerable to coercion.

We seek to help: we recognise that women sometimes seek an abortion through a lack of practical or emotional support. We aim to assist organisations who offer such support, as well as those who provide comfort and healing after an abortion.

Has your parish got a Journey to 2030 group?



Last year our Diocese made a public statement on the urgent matter of climate change; our ecological crisis. It was a public commitment to an ongoing conversion towards caring for the planet and our global family. This commitment is being realised through a campaign called 'The Journey to 2030'.

The Journey to 2030 is run by the **Ecological Conversion Group**, in partnership with the Diocese. It asks people and organisations to come together, using their many skills and influence to make a difference. We aim to actively live out Pope Francis' vision of Laudato Si' by taking practical steps, using the Pope's Encyclical Letter as both a blueprint and 'call to action'.
